Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement for Stoddard County, Missouri.

.. AREAS OF DENSE FOG LIKELY THIS AFTERNOON ACROSS PARTS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI

... FOR THOSE TRAVELING ALONG AND SOUTH OF HIGHWAY 60 FROM THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER, WESTWARD THROUGH SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, BE WATCHFUL FOR AREAS OF DENSE FOG DEVELOPING WITH TIME.

THE COMBINATION OF VERY LIGHT OR CALM WINDS AND A COMPLETELY SATURATED ATMOSPHERE LEFT BEHIND FROM THE RAIN EARLIER THIS MORNING HAS PRODUCED IDEAL CONDITIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF FOG. SPOTTER AND SURFACE OBSERVATIONS FROM DEXTER TO NEAR WEST PLAINS MISSOURI INDICATE VISIBILITIES RANGING FROM ONE QUARTER TO ONE HALF MILE.

AS YOU MOVE SOUTHWARD TOWARD THE ARKANSAS BORDER, VISIBILITIES MAY DROP TO NEAR ZERO.

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TRAVEL THIS AFTERNOON OR EVENING ACROSS EXTREME SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, THEN BE PREPARED TO ALLOW A LITTLE EXTRA TIME TO REACH YOUR DESTINATION. USE LOW BEAM HEADLIGHTS AND FOG LIGHTS, IF AVAILABLE, WHILE YOU TRAVEL.

BE SURE TO SIGNAL, IF YOU ARE CHANGING LANES OR TURNING ONTO OR OFF A ROAD. THESE FOGGY CONDITIONS WILL LIKELY PERSIST THROUGH MOST OF THE AFTERNOON.



... DENSE FOG ADVISORY IN EFFECT UNTIL 9 AM CST SATURDAY

... THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A DENSE FOG ADVISORY, WHICH IS IN EFFECT UNTIL 9 AM CST SATURDAY. *
VISIBILITY

... WILL BE ONE QUARTER MILE OR LESS AT TIMES OVER MUCH OF THE REGION. ANOTHER AREA OF RAIN WILL ARRIVE TOWARD MORNING

... AND THAT SHOULD BRING AN END TO THE DENSE FOG AS IT WORKS EASTWARD THROUGH THE REGION EARLY SATURDAY MORNING. *
IMPACTS

... DRIVERS TONIGHT INTO WEDNESDAY MORNING SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR RAPIDLY REDUCED VISIBILITIES AND ALLOW SOME EXTRA TIME TO REACH YOUR DESTINATIONS.

USE LOW BEAM HEADLIGHTS IN DENSE FOG.

HIGH BEAMS TEND TO CREATE MORE GLARE AND REDUCE THE VISIBILITY EVEN MORE. PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS

... A DENSE FOG ADVISORY MEANS VISIBILITIES WILL FREQUENTLY BE REDUCED TO LESS THAN ONE QUARTER MILE. IF DRIVING

... SLOW DOWN

... **USE YOUR HEADLIGHTS**

... AND LEAVE PLENTY OF DISTANCE AHEAD OF YOU

AND PARKING LOTS MAY BE VERY SLICK IF NOT TREATED. VEHICLES
WILL ICE OVER. PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS

.....GUSTY WINDS EXPECTED LATE TONIGHT INTO TUESDAY

.....INCREASING SOUTH WINDS WILL BECOME GUSTY LATE TONIGHT INTO TUESDAY. SUSTAINED WINDS WILL INCREASE TO 15 TO 25 MPH WITH GUSTS TO 30 MPH BY LATE TONIGHT, AND GUSTS OF 30 TO 35 MPH ARE EXPECTED AT TIMES DURING THE DAY TUESDAY.

THIS WILL CAUSE LOOSE OBJECTS TO BLOW AROUND, AND TRAVEL WILL BE DIFFICULT FOR HIGH PROFILE VEHICLES.

... FIRST ACCUMULATING SNOWFALL OF THE SEASON TONIGHT INTO THURSDAY

... ACCUMULATING SNOWFALL IS EXPECTED ACROSS THE REGION STARTING LATE TONIGHT AND CONTINUING THROUGH THURSDAY.

AREAS NORTH OF A PERRYVILLE MISSOURI TO SHAWNEETOWN ILLINOIS TO GREENVILLE KENTUCKY COULD SEE ONE TO THREE INCHES.

SEE THE WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY FOR ADDITIONAL DETAILS.

SNOW ACCUMULATIONS SOUTH OF THAT LINE WILL RANGE FROM JUST UNDER AN INCH TO A DUSTING OR LESS NEAR THE AR/MO AND KY/TN BORDERS.

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement for Dexter and the surrounding areas.

.....FIRST ACCUMULATING SNOW OF THE SEASON POSSIBLE THURSDAY

... WITH ARCTIC AIR ALREADY IN PLACE ACROSS THE REGION, AN UPPER-LEVEL STORM SYSTEM WILL PRODUCE A SWATH OF LIGHT SNOW, AS IT SWINGS THROUGH OUR REGION THURSDAY. THE INITIAL BAND OF LIGHT SNOW MAY REACH THE INTERSTATE 64 CORRIDOR OF

SOUTHERN ILLINOIS JUST PRIOR TO DAYBREAK THURSDAY, BUT THE BULK OF THE ACCUMULATING SNOWFALL IS EXPECTED IN THE MORNING HOURS.

1 TO 2 INCHES OF SNOW IS POSSIBLE ACROSS THE INTERSTATE 64 CORRIDOR OF SOUTHERN ILLINOIS AND SOUTHWEST INDIANA.

THE SNOW IS EXPECTED TO TAPER OFF QUICKLY FROM WEST TO EAST THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

FARTHER SOUTH ACROSS THE REGION, A HALF INCH OR LESS IS EXPECTED, AND MUCH OF THE AREA MAY ONLY SEE A FEW PERIODS OF FLURRIES. AT THIS TIME, CONSIDERABLE UNCERTAINTY EXISTS WITH THIS STORM SYSTEM.

ON THE HIGH END, THE POTENTIAL EXISTS FOR LIGHT ACCUMULATIONS ACROSS THE ENTIRE AREA, WITH NARROW BANDS OF ENHANCED SNOWFALL.

ON THE LOW END, A VERY MINOR ADJUSTMENT COULD RESULT IN NOTHING BUT FLURRIES ACROSS THE AREA. WITH THE COLD AIR IN PLACE, ANY ACCUMULATIONS WOULD LIKELY CREATE TRAVEL DIFFICULTIES. PLEASE STAY TUNED FOR THE LATEST FORECASTS AND STATEMENTS ON THIS POTENTIAL WINTER STORM SYSTEM FROM THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH, KENTUCKY.
