Special Weather Statement Issued by National Weather Service

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement for Stoddard County.

- ... LIGHT SNOW... SLEET AND FREEZING RAIN LIKELY IN SOME AREAS TONIGHT...
- A WEAK UPPER LEVEL DISTURBANCE WILL LIFT NORTHEAST INTO THE MID MISSISSIPPI RIVER VALLEY LATER TONIGHT. THIS WILL LIKELY CREATE LIGHT WINTRY PRECIPITATION AS IT MOVES OVER A COLD DOME OF HIGH PRESSURE NEAR THE SURFACE. MAINLY LIGHT SNOW IS EXPECTED TO OCCUR NORTH OF A MARBLE HILL MISSOURI TO VIENNA ILLINOIS TO GREENVILLE KENTUCKY LINE. A LIGHT WINTRY MIX AND EVEN SOME LIGHT FREEZING RAIN WILL BE LIKELY SOUTH OF THAT LINE. TRAVEL SHOULD NOT BE IMPACTED... MAINLY DUE TO THE RELATIVE WARM PAVEMENT TEMPERATURES AND AIR TEMPERATURES NEARING THE FREEZING

MARK. THE PRECIPITATION WILL TAPER OFF IN MOST LOCATIONS AFTER SUNRISE THURSDAY.

- ... DENSE FOG ADVISORY IN EFFECT UNTIL 8 AM CST FRIDAY...
- THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A DENSE FOG ADVISORY... WHICH IS IN EFFECT UNTIL 8 AM CST FRIDAY.

- AREAS OF DENSE FOG HAVE DEVELOPED ACROSS THE REGION... AND THE DENSE FOG WILL BECOME MORE WIDESPREAD THROUGH THE OVERNIGHT HOURS.
- * VISIBILITY: ONE QUARTER MILE OR LESS. VISIBILITIES ARE EXPECTED TO IMPROVE LATE TONIGHT INTO EARLY TOMORROW MORNING AS LIGHT RAIN SPREADS INTO THE REGION.
- * IMPACTS: MOTORISTS NEED TO ALLOW EXTRA TIME TO REACH THEIR DESTINATION.
- PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...
- A DENSE FOG ADVISORY MEANS VISIBILITIES WILL FREQUENTLY BE REDUCED TO LESS THAN ONE QUARTER MILE. IF DRIVING... SLOW DOWN... USE YOUR HEADLIGHTS... AND LEAVE PLENTY OF DISTANCE AHEAD OF YOU.

- ... FREEZING RAIN ADVISORY NOW IN EFFECT UNTIL 6 PM CST THIS EVENING...
- THE FREEZING RAIN ADVISORY IS NOW IN EFFECT UNTIL 6 PM CST THIS EVENING.
- * TODAY... LIGHT FREEZING RAIN IS EXPECTED TO DEVELOP...

POSSIBLY CAUSING TRAVEL ISSUES MAINLY ON ELEVATED SURFACES SUCH AS BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES. ISOLATED POCKETS OF SLEET MAY MIX IN WITH THE FREEZING RAIN AT TIMES... BUT ANY SLEET THAT DOES FALL SHOULD BE BRIEF AND OFFER LITTLE ADDITIONAL HAZARD.

- * RAIN WILL CHANGE OVER TO FREEZING RAIN EARLY AND CONTINUE THROUGH MUCH OF THE MORNING. THE FREEZING RAIN MAY AT TIMES MIX WITH SLEET.
- * ICE ACCUMULATIONS IN MOST AREAS SHOULD BE LIGHT. ISOLATED AMOUNTS OF A TENTH OF AN INCH OR MORE ARE POSSIBLE THOUGH.
- * TRAVELERS ACROSS THE ADVISORY TODAY SHOULD DO SO WITH EXTREME CAUTION... ESPECIALLY WHEN CROSSING BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES.
- PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...
- A FREEZING RAIN ADVISORY MEANS THAT LESS THAN ONE QUARTER INCH OF FREEZING RAIN OR FREEZING DRIZZLE WILL CAUSE HAZARDOUS TRAVEL CONDITIONS. BE PREPARED FOR SLIPPERY ROADS. SLOW DOWN AND USE CAUTION WHILE DRIVING.

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Freezing Rain Advisory for Stoddard County, Missouri.

- THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A FREEZING RAIN ADVISORY... WHICH IS IN EFFECT FROM 3 AM TO NOON CST MONDAY.
- * IMPACT: LATE TONIGHT RAIN IS EXPECTED TO FALL ONTO

FREEZING TEMPERATURES AT THE SURFACE POSSIBLY CAUSING TRAVEL ISSUES MAINLY ON ELEVATED SURFACES SUCH AS BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES.

- * TIMING: RAIN SHOULD START CHANGING OVER TO FREEZING RAIN OVER PARTS OF SOUTHERN ILLINOIS AND SOUTHEAST MISSOURI AFTER MIDNIGHT... THEN MIGRATE SOUTHEAST AS TEMPERATURES CONTINUE TO DECREASE.
- * ICE ACCUMULATIONS: ICE ACCUMULATIONS IN MOST AREAS SHOULD BE LIGHT BUT A FEW AREAS ALONG AND EITHER SIDE OF A LINE FROM CAPE GIRARDEAU TO POPLAR BLUFF MISSOURI COULD RECEIVE SLIGHTLY HIGHER AMOUNTS.
- * OTHER IMPACTS: PERSONS TRAVELING ACROSS THE ADVISORY LATE TONIGHT THROUGH MIDDAY MONDAY SHOULD DO SO WITH EXTREME CAUTION... ESPECIALLY WHEN CROSSING BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES.

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky

has issued a WINTER STORM WARNING for Stoddard County and parts of southeast Missouri.

WINTER STORM WARNING IN EFFECT FROM 6 PM THIS EVENING TO 6 AM CST MONDAY...

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WARNING FOR SLEET AND SNOW... WHICH IS IN EFFECT FROM 6 PM THIS EVENING TO 6 AM CST MONDAY. THE WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY IS NO LONGER IN EFFECT.

* TIMING... WINTRY PRECIPITATION WILL BECOME LIKELY BY THIS EVENING OVER MUCH OF THE AREA. ANY RAIN AT ONSET LATE TODAY SHOULD TRANSITION TO SLEET THEN SNOW THROUGH THE EARLY EVENING HOURS.

* SNOWFALL AMOUNTS... INCLUDING SOME SLEET... SHOULD RANGE FROM 3 TO 5 INCHES BEFORE THE SNOW TAPERS OFF LATER TONIGHT.

* IMPACTS... HAZARDOUS DRIVING CONDITIONS WILL BE THE MAIN IMPACT. CONDITIONS WILL CONTINUE TO BE QUITE HAZARDOUS DURING THE MORNING COMMUTE ON MONDAY. STRONG WEST TO NORTHWEST WINDS GUSTING UP TO 30 MPH ON MONDAY MAY CAUSE SOME BLOWING AND DRIFTING OF THE SNOW.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

A WINTER STORM WARNING MEANS SIGNIFICANT AMOUNTS OF SNOW... SLEET... AND ICE ARE EXPECTED OR OCCURRING. STRONG WINDS ARE ALSO POSSIBLE. THIS WILL MAKE TRAVEL VERY HAZARDOUS OR IMPOSSIBLE.
