### Spring Snow and Below Freezing Temperatures Are Possible

**Stoddard County, Missouri** - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement for our area.

- ... BELOW FREEZING TEMPERATURES MAY IMPACT EARLY GROWING VEGETATION THIS WEEKEND...
- THE MAJORITY OF PLANTS... VINES AND FRUIT TREES STILL REMAIN IN THE VERY EARLY BUDDING STAGES... SO THE BELOW FREEZING TEMPERATURES THIS WEEKEND WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THESE TYPES OF VEGETATION.
- HOWEVER... THE GROWTH OF SOME RESIDENTIAL PLANTS AND FLOWERS HAVE BEEN ACCELERATED BY THE RECENT SPELL OF WARM DAYS EARLIER THIS WEEK. ALTHOUGH THESE PLANTS ARE RATHER HARDY AND CAN WITHSTAND TEMPERATURES IN THE 20S FOR SEVERAL HOURS... TEMPERATURES IN THE UPPER 20S TO LOWER 30S ARE EXPECTED WEST OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER...

## COVERING PARTS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI.

- THERE WILL BE A CHANCE OF SNOW LATE TONIGHT OVER PARTS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI. ANY ACCUMULATION OF SNOW IS EXPECTED TO REMAIN LESS THAN A HALF AN INCH AT MOST. THE SNOW WILL ACTUALLY SERVE TO INSULATE OUTDOOR PLANTS FROM THE MOST SEVERE ASPECTS OF THE COLD TEMPERATURES.
- TEMPERATURES TONIGHT ARE NOT EXPECTED TO FALL BELOW FREEZING UNTIL AFTER 4 AM CDT SATURDAY MORNING... BUT COULD REMAIN BELOW FREEZING UNTIL 10 AM CDT SATURDAY MORNING.
- ON SATURDAY NIGHT... TEMPERATURES WILL LIKELY FALL BELOW FREEZING AROUND 5 AM CDT SUNDAY MORNING... RISING ABOVE THE FREEZING MARK AROUND 8 AM CDT SUNDAY MORNING.
- IF YOU HAVE CONCERN ABOUT PROTECTING YOUR OWN PLANTS AND FLOWERS... THEN YOU STILL HAVE TIME TO COVER THEM UP EARLY THIS EVENING.
- ABOVE FREEZING TEMPERATURES SHOULD BE THE RULE FROM SUNDAY NIGHT AND THROUGHOUT NEXT WEEK.

# Scattered Severe Storms Predicted for Our Area

## Scattered Severe Storms Predicted for Our Area

**Stoddard County, Missouri** - According to the Weather Channel we are in uncharted circumstances noting that the U.S. has not had one tornado during the month of

March. This is quite unusual for our area; however the first decent threat of severe thunderstorms this spring is in play Tuesday and Wednesday as two low-pressure systems ripple northeastward along a cold front from the southern Plains to the mid-Mississippi Valley.

Here is a look at the daily details:

**Tuesday:** Scattered severe storms should develop by late afternoon from far eastern Kansas and western Missouri to northeast Oklahoma and northwest Arkansas. This broken line of storms should then push east into the evening toward the mid-Mississippi Valley. Damaging wind gusts and large hail appear to be the primary threats, though a tornado cannot be ruled out.

**Wednesday:** Scattered severe thunderstorms should again break out by mid-late afternoon, this time near the intersection of a bulge in a surface dryline and cold front in Oklahoma, north Texas and southeast Kansas. During the evening, this activity is expected to form a squall line and push across central and southern Missouri and at least northern Arkansas. Damaging winds and large hail will again be the primary threats, but a tornado cannot be ruled out.

Always be prepared for severe weather!

WIDESPREAD RAIN AMOUNTS OF 1.5 TO 3 INCHES WILL BE POSSIBLE BEFORE ALL IS SAID AND DONE SATURDAY MORNING. LOCALLY HIGHER AMOUNTS CANNOT BE RULED OUT... AS THIS SYSTEM WILL BE LADEN WITH MOISTURE FROM THE GULF OF MEXICO.
- \* PLEASE MONITOR LATER FORECASTS AND BE ALERT FOR POSSIBLE FLOOD WARNINGS. THOSE LIVING IN AREAS PRONE TO FLOODING SHOULD BE PREPARED TO TAKE ACTION SHOULD FLOODING DEVELOP. THIS RAINFALL WILL ALSO LIKELY AGGRAVATE ONGOING RIVER FLOODING ACROSS THE REGION.

**Tue, Mar 3, 7:27 pm CST**

- ... LOCALLY DENSE FOG WILL CONTINUE THIS EVENING...
- THOSE OF YOU TRAVELING THROUGH THE QUAD STATE REGION WILL CONTINUE TO EXPERIENCE RAPID CHANGES IN VISIBILITY

DUE TO AREAS OF DENSE FOG THIS EVENING.

- WARM SOUTHERLY BREEZES ARE BRINGING ABOVE NORMAL TEMPERATURES TO THE REGION. THIS WARM AIR IS MOVING OVER THE RELATIVELY COLD GROUND. THIS IS CAUSING THE AIR NEAR THE SURFACE TO BECOME QUITE SATURATED... LEADING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF FOG. THE FOG WILL BE LOCALLY DENSE AT TIMES AND MAY VARY RAPIDLY FROM ONE LOCATION TO ANOTHER.
- BE PREPARED FOR RAPID CHANGES IN VISIBILITY WHILE YOU ARE DRIVING ON ROADWAYS. MAKE SURE THAT YOU KEEP YOUR HEADLIGHTS ON LOW... SIGNAL YOUR INTENTIONS WELL AHEAD OF TIME... SLOW DOWN AND LEAVE PLENTY OF ROOM BETWEEN YOURSELF AND OTHER DRIVERS ON THE ROAD.
- AS RAIN CONTINUES TO OVERSPREAD THE REGION... VISIBILITIES DUE TO THE FOG WILL LIKELY IMPROVE SOME. DRIVERS WILL THEN NEED TO BE WATCHFUL FOR PONDING OF WATER ON ROADWAYS AND LOW LYING AREAS.

- ... WINTER STORM WARNING IN EFFECT FROM 6 AM WEDNESDAY TO 6 AM CST THURSDAY...
- THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WARNING FOR SNOW... SLEET... AND FREEZING RAIN WHICH IS IN EFFECT FROM 6 AM WEDNESDAY TO 6 AM CST THURSDAY. THE WINTER STORM WATCH IS NO LONGER IN EFFECT.
- \* TIMING: RAIN SHOULD BEGIN CHANGING OVER TO FREEZING RAIN... SLEET AND SNOW FROM NORTHWEST TO SOUTHEAST STARTING EARLY WEDNESDAY MORNING. THE CHANGEOVER TO SNOW WILL PROGRESS SOUTHEASTWARD THROUGHOUT THE DAY. THE CHANGEOVER TO SLEET AND SNOW IS NOT EXPECTED TO OCCUR UNTIL WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON GENERALLY SOUTH AND EAST OF THE OHIO RIVER. THE SNOW WILL THEN TAPER OFF FROM NORTHWEST TO SOUTHEAST WEDNESDAY NIGHT.
- \* MAIN IMPACT: BY EARLY THURSDAY MORNING... SNOWFALL TOTALS ARE EXPECTED TO RANGE FROM FOUR TO SIX INCHES GENERALLY NORTH AND WEST OF A LINE FROM MOUNT CARMEL ILLINOIS TO PERRYVILLE TO VAN BUREN TO DONIPHAN MISSOURI. SOUTH AND EAST OF THAT LINE SIX TO EIGHT INCHES ARE POSSIBLE. AN EIGHT TO TEN INCH SWATH OF SNOWFALL IS POSSIBLE GENERALLY TWENTY-FIVE MILES EITHER SIDE OF A LINE FROM NEW MADRID MISSOURI TO CALHOUN KENTUCKY. AS MUCH AS ONE INCH OF SLEET MAY FALL PRIOR TO THE SNOW... PARTICULARLY ACROSS WESTERN KENTUCKY AND FAR SOUTHEAST MISSOURI.
- \* OTHER IMPACTS: THIS MUCH SNOW AND SLEET WILL PRODUCE TREACHEROUS CONDITIONS AND CAUSE SIGNIFICANT TRAVEL ISSUES ACROSS THE REGION. ISOLATED POWER OUTAGES WILL ALSO BE POSSIBLE. CONFIDENCE IS HIGH IN THE OUTCOME OF THIS STORM SYSTEM SO MAKE PREPARATIONS NOW. STAY TUNED FOR UPDATES AND POSSIBLE ADJUSTMENTS TO SNOWFALL TOTALS.

- ... WINTER STORM WATCH IN EFFECT FROM WEDNESDAY MORNING THROUGH LATE WEDNESDAY NIGHT...

- THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WATCH... WHICH IS IN EFFECT FROM WEDNESDAY MORNING THROUGH LATE WEDNESDAY NIGHT.
- \* TIMING: RAIN SHOULD BEGIN CHANGING OVER TO SLEET AND SNOW FROM NORTHWEST TO SOUTHEAST STARTING EARLY WEDNESDAY MORNING. ACCUMULATING SNOWFALL SHOULD CONTINUE THROUGH EARLY THURSDAY MORNING WITH THE HIGHEST ACCUMULATIONS EXPECTED WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON AND EVENING.
- \* MAIN IMPACT: BY EARLY THURSDAY MORNING SNOWFALL TOTALS ARE EXPECTED TO RANGE FROM FOUR TO SIX INCHES GENERALLY NORTH AND WEST OF A LINE FROM ROCKPORT INDIANA TO DEXTER MISSOURI WITH SIX TO TEN INCHES POSSIBLE SOUTH AND EAST OF THAT LINE.
- \* OTHER IMPACTS: THIS MUCH SNOWFALL WILL CAUSE NUMEROUS TRAVEL ISSUES ACROSS THE REGION. PERSONS IN THESE AREAS SHOULD MAKE PREPARATIONS NOW FOR THIS UPCOMING WINTER STORM AND STAY TUNED FOR UPDATES AND THE POSSIBLE UPGRADE TO A WINTER STORM WARNING.
- PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...
- A WINTER STORM WATCH MEANS THERE IS A POTENTIAL FOR SIGNIFICANT SNOW... SLEET... OR ICE ACCUMULATIONS THAT WOULD GREATLY IMPACT TRAVEL. STAY TUNED FOR LATER STATEMENTS. THIS WATCH WILL BE UPGRADED TO A WARNING IF WINTER STORM CONDITIONS BECOME MORE CERTAIN.
