Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 10PM CST TUE

... BITTER COLD IS IN STORE FOR THE AREA TONIGHT THROUGH WEDNESDAY.

FIRST, AREAS NORTH OF A MARBLE HILL MISSOURI, VIENNA ILLINOIS, CALHOUN KENTUCKY LINE CAN EXPECT LOWEST WIND CHILLS LATE TONIGHT THROUGH MIDDAY WEDNESDAY TO RANGE FROM -10 TO -20.

A WIND CHILL ADVISORY REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR THIS AREA. OVER THE REST OF THE REGION, INCLUDING MUCH OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI AND WEST KENTUCKY, LOWEST WIND CHILL VALUES WILL BE ZERO TO

-10.

ADDITIONALLY, THERE IS A CHANCE OF LIGHT SNOW SHOWERS TONIGHT. CONFIDENCE IS STILL LOW WITH HOW THIS MINOR EVENT WILL PLAY OUT. WORST CASE SCENARIO IS SOME PLACES FROM SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, INTO WEST KENTUCKY AND THE SOUTHERN TIP OF ILLINOIS COULD RECEIVE UP TO OR AROUND 1 INCH OF DRY SNOW. OR, THERE MAY BE LITTLE IN THE WAY OF SNOW ACCUMULATION.

THIS WEATHER SYSTEM DOES NOT HAVE MUCH MOISTURE TO WORK WITH. THAT IS WHAT INCREASES OUR UNCERTAINTY.

STAY TUNED FOR UPDATES INTO THE EVENING HOURS. WARMER WEATHER WILL QUICKLY RETURN BEGINNING THURSDAY.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 4:15PM CST TUE

...BITTERLY COLD TEMPERATURES IN STORE FOR THE QUAD STATE REGION.

.. IT WILL BE BITTERLY COLD AT TIMES TONIGHT THROUGH WEDNESDAY NIGHT AS A FRIGID ARCTIC AIRMASS SPREADS ACROSS THE AREA. THE LEADING EDGE OF THE MAIN CORE OF COLD ARCTIC AIR WILL MOVE THROUGH THE QUAD STATE REGION BY THIS EVENING.

LOW TEMPERATURES BY WEDNESDAY MORNING WILL BE NEAR ZERO ALONG THE INTERSTATE 64 CORRIDOR TO THE LOWER TEENS NEAR THE ARKANSAS AND TENNESSEE BORDERS. WIND CHILL TEMPERATURES OVERNIGHT WILL FALL INTO THE 10 TO 20 DEGREES BELOW ZERO RANGE ACROSS PORTIONS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS, SOUTHWEST INDIANA AND NORTHWEST KENTUCKY.

A WIND CHILL ADVISORY HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR AREAS NORTH OF A MARBLE HILL MISSOURI, VIENNA ILLINOIS, CALHOUN KENTUCKY LINE FOR LATE TONIGHT THROUGH MIDDAY WEDNESDAY. SOUTHWARD, INTO THE REST OF WEST KENTUCKY AND SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, WIND CHILLS DURING THIS SAME TIME FRAME WILL BE ZERO TO 10 BELOW. THE VERY COLD WEATHER WILL LAST INTO WEDNESDAY NIGHT.

THIS COLD SNAP WILL INCREASE THE LIKELIHOOD OF FROSTBITE AND HYPOTHERMIA IF PRECAUTIONS ARE NOT TAKEN. WE WILL QUICKLY BREAK OUT OF THE COLD, WITH MUCH WARMER CONDITIONS RETURNING BY THE END OF THE WEEK.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 4AM CST TUE

...SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT

... IT WILL BE BITTERLY COLD AT TIMES TONIGHT THROUGH WEDNESDAY NIGHT AS A FRIGID ARCTIC AIRMASS SPREADS ACROSS THE AREA.

LOWS TONIGHT WILL BE IN THE TEENS, WITH WIND CHILL TEMPERATURES RANGING FROM JUST BELOW ZERO ALONG INTERSTATE 64 TO AROUND 5 ABOVE TOWARD THE TENNESSEE AND ARKANSAS STATE LINES BY LATE TONIGHT. HIGHS TUESDAY WILL RANGE FROM THE MID 20S TO LOWER 30S.

TUESDAY EVENING, THE TRUE ARCTIC FRONT WILL MOVE THROUGH, DROPPING WIND CHILL TEMPERATURES INTO THE 10 TO 20 DEGREES BELOW ZERO RANGE ACROSS PORTIONS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS, SOUTHWEST INDIANA AND NORTHWEST KENTUCKY.

A WIND CHILL ADVISORY HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR AREAS NORTH OF A MARBLE HILL MISSOURI, VIENNA ILLINOIS, CALHOUN KENTUCKY LINE FOR LATE TUESDAY NIGHT THROUGH MIDDAY WEDNESDAY. SOUTH INTO THE REST OF WEST KENTUCKY AND SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, WIND CHILLS DURING THIS TIME FRAME WILL BE ZERO TO 10 BELOW.

WE WILL QUICKLY BREAK OUT OF THE COLD, WITH MUCH WARMER CONDITIONS RETURNING BY THE END OF THE WEEK.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 6PM CST MON

...BLACK ICE MAY BE A CONCERN FOR TRAVELERS OVERNIGHT ACROSS THE QUAD STATE

... SUNSHINE ACROSS THE PARTS OF THE QUAD STATE EARLY MONDAY ALLOWED FOR MELTING OF SOME OF THE WIDESPREAD SNOW COVER

THAT FELL OVER THE REGION THIS PAST WEEKEND.

AFTER SUNSET, TEMPERATURES ARE EXPECTED TO REMAIN BELOW FREEZING, BEFORE GRADUALLY WARMING UP FROM THE SOUTH AFTER MIDNIGHT AND INTO EARLY WEDNESDAY. WHERE TEMPERATURES REMAIN BELOW FREEZING, SOME OF THE WATER FROM THE SNOW THAT HAS MELTED WILL REFREEZE AS A THIN TRANSPARENT LAYER OF ICE, KNOWN AS BLACK ICE.

ALTHOUGH SOME ROADS MAY HAVE BEEN TREATED WITH SALT, A MAJORITY OF SECONDARY ROADS MAY STILL BE UNTREATED AND SUBJECT TO REFREEZING OF WATER ON THE ROADWAYS.

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TRAVEL TONIGHT, EXERCISE CAUTION AND ALLOW A LITTLE EXTRA TIME TO REACH YOUR DESTINATION. BE ESPECIALLY CAUTIOUS FOR ICE ON BRIDGES, OVERPASSES, AND ELEVATED WALKWAYS.

FOR PEDESTRIANS, BE WATCHFUL FOR WET SPOTS ON SIDEWALKS THAT MAY FREEZE OVER. TEMPERATURES SHOULD RISE ABOVE FREEZING OVER ALL THE QUAD STATE REGION BETWEEN 7 AM AND 10 AM ON WEDNESDAY

...WINTER STORM WARNING IN EFFECT UNTIL MIDNIGHT CST TONIGHT...

*** WHAT...HEAVY SNOW. STORM TOTAL ACCUMULATIONS 3 TO 7 INCHES. WINDS GUSTING AS HIGH AS 40 MPH.**

*** WHERE...PORTIONS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, WESTERN KENTUCKY**

AND SOUTHERN ILLINOIS.

* WHEN...UNTIL MIDNIGHT CST TONIGHT. * ADDITIONAL DETAILS...PLAN ON EXTREMELY HAZARDOUS TRAVEL CONDITIONS. THE STRONG WINDS AND HEAVY SNOW RATES WILL CAUSE EXTREMELY LOW VISIBILITIES. THERE HAVE ALREADY BEEN NUMEROUS ACCIDENTS REPORTED. PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY FROM 12PM CST SAT UNTIL 12AM CST SUN

...WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY IN EFFECT FROM NOON SATURDAY TO MIDNIGHT CST SATURDAY NIGHT

* WHAT...RAIN WILL CHANGE TO SNOW SATURDAY AFTERNOON INTO SATURDAY NIGHT. ACCUMULATIONS OF 1 TO 2 INCHES, WITH LOCALLY HIGHER AMOUNTS POSSIBLE, ARE EXPECTED ACROSS THE NORTH, WITH GENERALLY LESS THAN 1 INCH AMOUNTS ACROSS THE SOUTH.

* WHERE...1 TO 2 INCH ACCUMULATIONS ARE EXPECTED MAINLY NORTH OF THE OHIO RIVER. LOCALLY HIGHER AMOUNTS UPWARDS TO 3 INCHES MAY OCCUR ALONG AND NORTH OF A PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO MOUNT VERNON, ILLINOIS LINE. GENERALLY LESS THAN 1 INCH AMOUNTS ARE EXPECTED SOUTH OF THE OHIO RIVER.

* WHEN...RAIN WILL CHANGE TO SNOW SATURDAY AFTERNOON FOR MOST PLACES NORTH OF THE OHIO RIVER. SOUTH OF THE OHIO RIVER, RAIN WILL CHANGE TO SNOW TOWARD THE END OF THE DAY SATURDAY, INTO SATURDAY EVENING.

* ADDITIONAL DETAILS...THIS POTENT WEATHER SYSTEM WILL BRING AN ARCTIC BLAST OF AIR WITH A MYRIAD OF IMPACTS. STRONG AND GUSTY WINDS WILL IMPACT TRAVEL AND ALSO BRING IN COLD AIR WITH SINGLE DIGIT TO LOWER TEENS WIND CHILLS. PLUNGING SUB FREEZING TEMPERATURES WILL CREATE FLASH FREEZE AND BLACK ICE POTENTIAL FOR ANY RESIDUAL GROUND OR ROADWAY MOISTURE. IN ADDITION, WINDS MAY PRODUCE REDUCED VISIBILITY WHERE BLOWING SNOW IS MODERATE TO HEAVY. PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY MEANS THAT PERIODS OF SNOW...SLEET...OR FREEZING RAIN WILL CAUSE TRAVEL DIFFICULTIES. BE PREPARED FOR SLIPPERY ROADS AND LIMITED VISIBILITIES...AND USE CAUTION WHILE DRIVING. Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued updated a SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT until 5 a.m. Friday morning for Stoddard County.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 5AM CST FRI

...WET START TO WEEKEND OUTLOOK...

...CONFIDENCE STILL EXISTS FOR SOME ACCUMULATING SNOWS,

ESPECIALLY NORTH, SATURDAY AFTERNOON INTO SATURDAY NIGHT...

THE MODELS ARE HONING IN ON WHAT LOOKS TO BE A SOGGY START TO THE WEEKEND.

ESTIMATED FORECAST STORM TOTAL RAINFALL FOR FRIDAY NIGHT THROUGH SATURDAY AVERAGES FROM ONE INCH ACROSS OUR NORTH, TO CLOSER TO 1.5 INCHES ACROSS OUR SOUTH. THESE AMOUNTS WILL BE FALLING OVER GROUNDS THAT HAVE RECENTLY RECEIVED GOOD RAINS, SO BE AWARE THAT RIVERS, CREEKS, AND STREAMS MAY RISE MORE QUICKLY, AND STREETS AND LOW LANDS COULD INUNDATE A LITTLE MORE QUICKLY THAN USUAL.

THE MODELS ALSO ARE HONING IN WITH A CONSISTENT SIGNAL FOR A CHANGEOVER TO OCCUR FROM RAIN TO SNOW, AS ARCTIC COLD AIR SLAMS INTO THE AREA WITH THE SYSTEM'S PASSAGE. THIS CHANGEOVER WILL OCCUR AS EARLY AS SATURDAY AFTERNOON ACROSS OUR NORTHWEST, AND WILL TRANSITION SOUTHEASTWARD ACROSS THE ENTIRE AREA LATER SATURDAY INTO SATURDAY NIGHT.

THE BEST CHANCE FOR ACCUMULATING SNOWS STILL LOOKS TO BE NORTH OF THE OHIO RIVER, ESPECIALLY ACROSS OUR NORTHERN THIRD OF THE REGION, OR ALONG AND NORTH OF A LINE FROM ABOUT PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO MOUNT CARMEL, ILLINOIS.

LIGHTER ACCUMULATIONS ARE ANTICIPATED SOUTH OF THE OHIO RIVER, IF ANY. BLUSTERY NORTH WINDS THAT ACCOMPANY THE ARCTIC BLAST LATE SATURDAY INTO SATURDAY NIGHT COULD LEAD TO SOME BLOWING SNOW, AND WILL DRIVE TEMPERATURES DOWN INTO THE TEENS AND 20S. PATCHY BLACK ICE IS A POSSIBILITY FOR DRIVERS, ESPECIALLY ON BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES. I

IN ADDITION, WIND CHILL VALUES BY SUNDAY MORNING ARE EXPECTED TO REACH THE SINGLE DIGITS AND LOWER TEENS IN MANY AREAS.
