Norman H. Lowes, 85, of Jackson, formerly of Dexter, passed away Thursday, March 31, 2011, at Southeast Hospital in Cape Girardeau.

He was born July 12, 1925, in Jackson, to Emil and Emma Voges Lowes. He was baptized and confirmed at Hanover Lutheran Church. He attended the former Clover Hill School in Jackson, the former Hanover Lutheran School in Cape, and was a graduate of Jackson High School. He and JoAnn Crites were married November 23, 1951, at the Hanover Lutheran Parsonage. They resided in Dexter 48 years.

Norman honorably served as a corporal in the U.S. Marines from February 15, 1944 to August 15, 1946.

Upon returning from the military, he became employed at Union Electric, retiring in 1985. He and JoAnn moved back to Jackson in 2005.

Norman was a member of Hanover Lutheran Church in Cape Girardeau, Altenthal-Joerns American Legion Post #158 in Jackson, and was a former active member of Faith Lutheran Church in Dexter. Interment will follow in the church cemetery with full military honors.

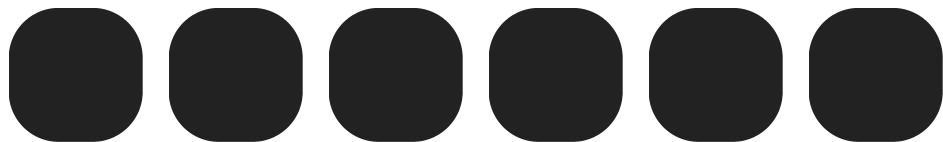
