Bearcats Send Three Golfers To State

The Bearcats Golf Team qualified three of four sectional golfers for the MSHAA Class 3 State Tournament on Thursday at Dalhousie Golf Club.

Cody Stevens, Brennen Justice and Logan Robey all placed within the top 12 positions to advance.

Cody Stevens led the team with a score of 83 to lead the Bearcats. Bernnen Justice followed with an 85 and Logan Robey ended the day with a score of 89. Alan Flanigan also qualified for sectional play but was unable to make the cut.

To those who have spent a little time at Hidden Trails Country Club, all three of these Bearcats were easy to find somewhere on the course perfecting their game.

Cody has had a tremendous career all sports seasons. Cody's athleticism shows quickly as his 2010-11 sports have produced football quarter final action, state wrestling tournament action and now he will see the State level in golf.

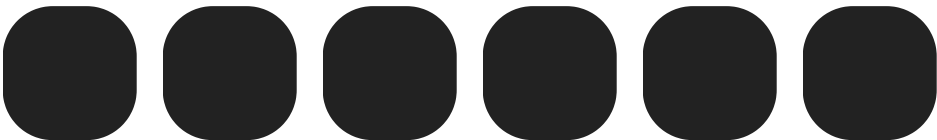

Softball had 'fun season'

Lady Bearcats coach Tammy Crowley had a young team this spring, and despite a season cut short due to weather conditions, she said the girls had a good season.

"We had a lot of fun this year. We had a very successful season even though our season was cut short because of the rain and flooding," Crowley told the crowd.

The team ended the season with 8 wins, 6 losses and 1 tie. The Lady 'Cats placed third in the Malden Tournament.

"We worked very hard during the season on a variety of drills to improve our batting, throwing and fielding," the coach reported. "I had two really good pitchers this year –

Alec Jackson and Kendra Stephenson. They helped us lot and combined with our good defense.”

Over half of the Lady ‘Cats that took the field this spring were freshmen and just one senior player was on the squad.

“I look for great things from this group for the next several years,” she said.

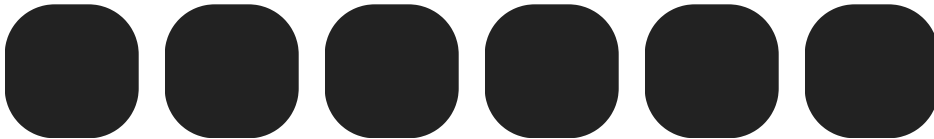

The game was originally scheduled for Friday, April 23, but was postponed due to flooding in the region.

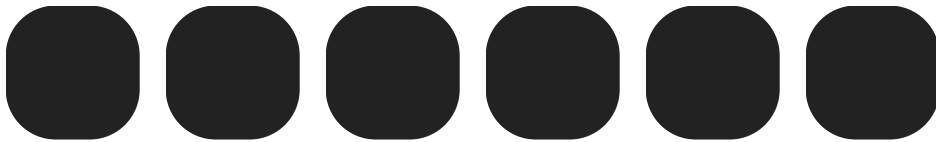
The game will be held in Brosley, Mo. and is set for a 2:45 p.m. first pitch. There will be just varsity action; the JV will not play.

According to Powers, the school doesn't schedule any games after the Spring Sports Banquet, which is scheduled for Thursday (May 5) night.

"We have not scheduled softball games after the Spring Sports Banquet," Powers continued. "Coach Crowley gives out her awards at the banquet, and to continue the season after the banquet would keep that from happening."

In the program's last season under the helm of coach Tammy Crowley (she announced her resignation of the position in an April School Board Meeting), the Lady 'Cats posted a 8-6-1 record, including a Third place finish in the Malden Tournament.

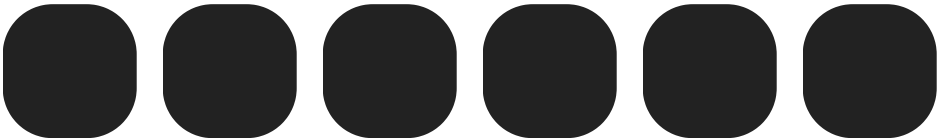
