According to reading teacher Felicia Powers, the primary focus of Accelerated Reader is reading comprehension.

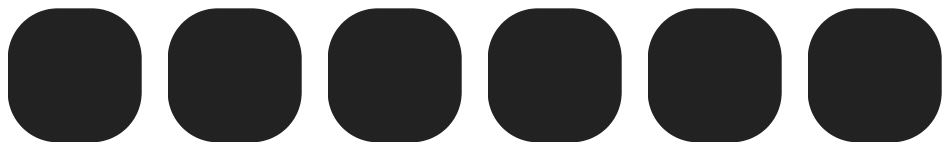
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
