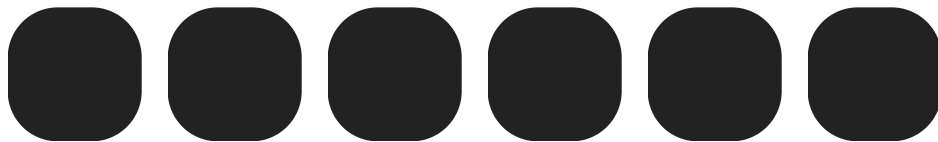

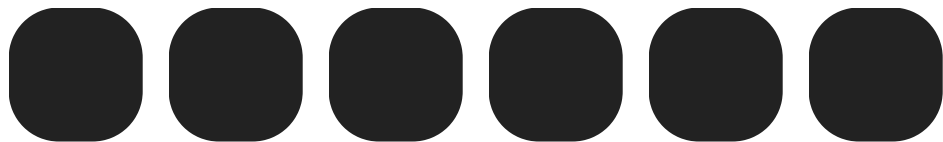
Interment will follow in the Missouri Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield with full Military Honors.
