

Barbara was an active member of the Michigan State Retirees Association for many years


and was a long-standing member of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Visitation will be Tuesday, July 12, 2011, from 5 to 8 p.m., at the Watkins & Sons Funeral Home in Dexter, Missouri.


