and friends also survive. She was preceded in death by one brother, Herman Stratman, one sister, Beulah Stratman and three half brothers.

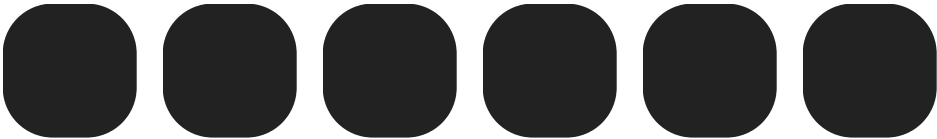

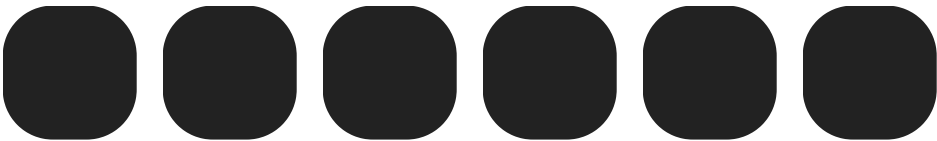
Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, D.J. Long and Bobby Long.
