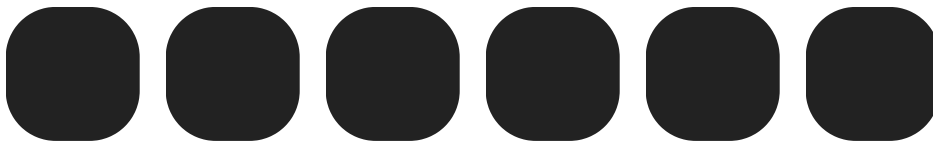
Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by two sisters, Essie Vinson and Madge Evans.
