

Chamber Gathers For Last 2011 Meeting

A record crowd attended Thursday's Dexter Chamber of Commerce Full Membership meeting and learned of some of the accomplishments during the last year.

Chamber President Ed Gargas presided at the final meeting of the year, with 90 chamber members participating. The meeting had the largest turnout ever for a December meeting.

He noted that in the last year the chamber has hosted more than 20 Ribbon Cutting Celebrations, had 31 new members and 11 new businesses in the Dexter community.
