



Poor Shooting Sinks Lady Raiders

POPLAR BLUFF - Shooting was the theme of the night in Tuesday's game between the Three Rivers Lady Raiders and Arkansas Baptist.

For Three Rivers, it was a lack of it. For the Lady Buffaloes, it was getting it at the right time.

The Lady Raiders shot just 39 percent (21-of-54) from the field – and just 26 percent (five-for-19) in the first half – and also struggled at the free-throw line (20-of-40), while Arkansas Baptist hit four 3-pointers as part of a game-changing 14-3 run late in the game to rally for a 71-65 win at the Bess Activity Center.

"Free throws. Free throws," Three Rivers coach Jeff Walk said. "And f we make a few more free throws and commit a few less turnovers, we win. You can't write that any other way."

Three Rivers (6-5) took a 45-42 lead on Carolyn Overton's free throws with 9:46 to go, but the Lady Buffaloes connected on four treys – the first two by Jerrica Walls – as part of a 14-3 spurt, taking a 56-48 lead on Caitlyn Williams's triple with just under five and a half minutes to go.

"We went to a triangle-and-two defense trying to shut that down, then someone else started making them," said Walk. "It was just pick your poison. Sometimes as coaching goes, you overcoach instead of letting the game happen."

The Lady Raiders could get no closer than five points the rest of the way.

After a dismal start that saw Three Rivers make just five baskets in the first half and miss 11 of its 19 shots from the foul line, back-to-back baskets by Carolyn Overton ignited a 19-5 run as the Lady Raiders took a 37-31 lead on Candace Miller's free throws with

However, Arkansas Baptist began to chip away, cutting the lead to 43-42 on Gabby Jenkins's free throw with 9:50 before going on its game-turning run.

Overton paced Three Rivers with 18 points and 14 rebounds, while Whitney Mills added 13 points and Abbie Warren finished with 10.

"We got beat but the kids battled all the way through," Walk said. "That is something to build on. And they're the most athletic team we'll play all year."

Cassie Vaughn and Ashley Qualls led the Lady Buffaloes with 12 points apiece.

The Lady Raiders are off until January 3, when they travel to Williams Baptist for a rematch of the season opener.

'Cats Show Signs Of Improvement At Jackson

JACKSON - The Bearcats are still searching for that ever-elusive first win, but they took a big step forward in Tuesday night's contest against the Jackson Indians.

After a 70-50 loss to Jackson last Tuesday in the second round of the SEMO Conference Tournament, the Bearcats took to the court in hopes of exacting some revenge against the Indians, but after a four-quarter battle, the 'Cats fell 66-58.

The Indians have a distinct size advantage over the 'Cats - four of their five starters were 6'2" or taller - but Jake Lee played a great game in the paint despite being nearly six inches shorter.

The 'Cats were also without the services of Chase Young, who was out with a knee injury.

Lee led the Bearcats in scoring with 25 points. D.J. Dowdy and Tyler Miller were the only other Bearcats in double-figures, with 15 and 12 points, respectively.

Lee had his hands full throughout the contest, but did a great job slowing down the 6'9" John Meyer, holding him to just 10 points in the contest.

Miller and Lee were the only Bearcats that were able to find the basket during the opening frame of the game; the duo combined for 11 points. The Indians were able to barely edge a 13-11 lead at the end of the first.


