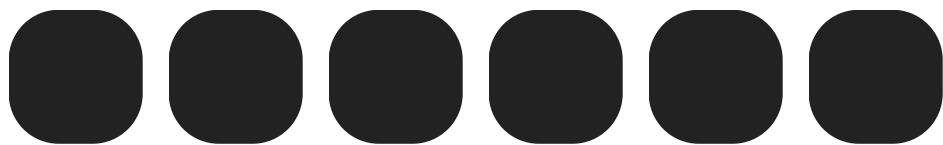
Interment will be in the Puxico City Cemetery in Puxico, with Watkins & Sons of Puxico in charge of arrangements.
