## Owls Comeback Attempt Falls Short

### Owls Comeback Attempt Falls Short

Fulton, Mo. -- The William Woods University womens' basketball team saw its furious comeback attempt fall just short on Thursday night as the team lost 65-68 to Hannibal-LaGrange University. Sharron Andrews (Oakland/Hayward, Calif.) posted her fourth double-double (17 pts, 11 reb.) of the season and the team's sixth in as many games, but an HLG 3-pointer with 1.1 seconds stunned the #22-ranked Owls.

WWU quickly found itself on the wrong side of a 8-0 run, missing its first four attempts from the floor and failing to capitalize on three Trojan turnovers. The Owls sputtered to life, but still found themselves down 5-10 with 14:52 to go in the half.

A Ciara Tatum (Columbia, Mo.) jumper in the lane with 11:26 left in the first half finally seemed to rouse the Owls, with a 17-9 run putting William Woods up 26-22 with just over a minute to go, but HLG was able to close out the half with two makes and pick up a defensive stop to leave the teams knotted at 26-26.

Coming out of the break, WWU was simply no match for the hot-shooting Trojans, as HLG connected on its next 13 attempts - 8-of-8 FG, 5-of-5 FT - to take a 50-37 lead with 13:21 to go.

Miranda Loesch (Lohman, Mo.) finally stopped the HLG run with 12:58 on the clock, as she stoned Trenee Thornton in the low post. The senior picked up the rebound as well following the rejection, adding a second rebound in the space of 30 seconds off a missed Tatum free throw. Loesch found an open Megan Aubuchon (Old Monroe, Mo.) for three

to bookend a 7-0 spurt pulling WWU to within six, but as quickly as the Owls reeled in the Trojans, HLG responded, pulling back to 46-57 with 7:11 left.

The Owls would eventually battle back , with a pair of Loesch free throws closing the gap to 61-65 with 1:12 on the clock. Andrews got the Anderson Arena crowd on its feet with two quick baskets, converting after the Owls drew a charge and picking the pocket of Klara Glor with just 14 seconds left to tie the game at 65-65.

HLG was able to find an open look on its next possession, however, as Ashleigh Spencer drained a trey with 1.1 seconds to go and WWU wasn't able to get a clean look as time expired.

William Woods falls to 10-5 on the season, and 0-1 in AMC play. In addition to Andrew's double-double, Aubuchon had 22 points to lead the Owls. Ashley Wilson also recorded a double-double on the evening, with the HLG senior leading all scorers with 27 points and adding 11 rebounds. Spencer also finished in double figures, with 21 on the night for the Trojans.

Both teams shot considerably better in the second half, with the Owls hitting at a .560 pace to close with a .431 overall mark from the floor. The Trojans mustered a .577 pace to end the contest at a .472 clip. WWU edged out HLG in the rebounding battle 32-31 as well.

The Owls hit the road for the next two AMC contests, with Park University offering the next test. Tipoff for Saturday's game between WWU and the Pirates is set for 2 p.m.

## Cold Shooting Plagues Lady Miners In Loss

### Cold Shooting Plagues Lady Miners In Loss

ROLLA – The cold temperatures outside Rolla found its way inside the Bullman Multi-Purpose Building on Thursday evening as the 24th ranked Missouri S&T Lady Miners fell to Northern Kentucky 52-34.

It was the fewest points S&T's scored in a game since a 61-23 loss at Truman on Jan. 23, 2002.

The first half was a defensive struggle as both sides struggled to score for a majority of the half. S&T (10-3, 5-1 GLVC) was hitting early knocking down five of its first nine shots to take an 11-7 lead on a jumper by Taylor Jensen at the 11:17 mark.

The Norse (11-2, 4-1 GLVC) regained the lead by scoring the next six points, but Julie Meyer tied the game with a jumper at the 7:33 mark.

The Lady Miners went cold the rest of the half missing their final 10 shots as NKU closed the frame on a 10-0 run behind the play of Casse Mogan and Ellen Holton. The two combined for 17 of the Norse's 23 points in the frame.

S&T went scoreless over the final 7:33 of the first half.

The Lady Miners turned it over 10 times which resulted in 11 points for Northern Kentucky. S&T was just 6-for-24 (25 percent) from the field while the Norse shot 38.5 percent (10-for-26). The Lady Miners held a 17-16 lead on the glass.

Meyer and Parks had four each to lead the Lady Miners.

S&T scored six of the first eight points to begin the second half to cut the lead to six points just two minutes in, but the Norse responded with five straight pushing the advantage back to double figures.

The Lady Miners got as close as 30-23 on a pair of free throws by Parks at the 15:19 mark. From there NKU went on a 13-2 run over the next six minutes to build an 18 point lead on a jumper by Kelsey Simpson.

S&T got as close as 15 points on an old-fashioned three-point play from Kemp with at the 7:10 mark.

The Norse answered extending their lead to 20 and didn't look back settling on the 18 point advantage.

The Lady Miners were just 6-of-28 (21.4 percent) in the second in shooting a season-low 23 percent (12-for-52) from the field. Parks and Kemp led S&T with 10 apiece while Meyer added six. Parks also added nine rebounds.

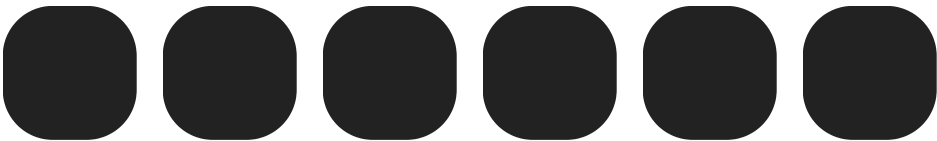
NKU shot 50 percent in the second half to finish the contest shooting 21-of-48 (44 percent) from the floor. It also outrebounded the Lady Miners by a 37-to-29 margin. Mogan led all scorers with 18 while Holton dropped in 13. Holton and Sadie Bowling had eight rebounds apiece.

S&T returns home on Saturday to take on Bellarmine at 1 p.m.

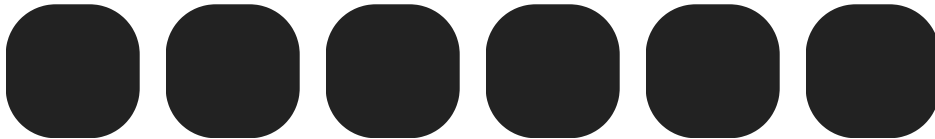

## Lady 'Cats Extend Win Streak To Ten Games

Lady 'Cats Extend Win Streak To Ten Games

The Lady Bearcats extended their win streak to 10 games on Thursday night at the Bearcat Event Center with a 73-27 shellacking of the Neelyville Lady Tigers. The Lady 'Cats had four players in double-figures in the contest that included a 10 minute stretch of shutout basketball.

The Lady 'Cats jumped out to a 21-8 lead after the first quarter, thanks in part to a pair of threes from Alison Jarrell and another trey from Erika Cobb, as well as an excellent defensive effort.

"I thought defensively we did a really good job tonight," LBB head coach Chad Allen said. "The last time we played then, in the Christmas Tournament, we gave up quite a few more points, and I thought we did a much better job of putting pressure on them and not giving them any good looks."

The Lady 'Cats opened the contest in a man-to-man press instead of their usual matchup-zone press; the Tigers have been one of the few teams to figure out the Lady Bearcats' zone press so far this season.

"I thought that really set the tone early, coming out in man in the full-court press. It really got us moving, and when we did go to the matchup, I thought we did really good in it as well," Allen noted. "Overall, our girls were really active and really guarded well."

Chelsie Kovach hit a deep three in the first minute of the second quarter, but it was the only offensive production for the rest of the first half by the Tigers. The Lady 'Cats dominated the glass on both ends of the floor, and were able to tack on 16 more points in the second to take a 37-11 lead into the locker room.

Jarrell and Cobb were both good from downtown in the third quarter, while Paige Patterson dropped in seven points in the frame. Kayla Maupin dropped in a bucket at the 3:38 mark for the Lady Tigers' first points in over 10 minutes, but the Lady Bearcats racked up a game-high 27 points in the third to take a 64-15 lead.

Maupin's  three point

play was the highlight of the fourth quarter for the Tigers, as the Lady 'Cats maintained a 30 point margin and kept the clock running throughout the frame. Hannah Noe buried a deep three at the 4:00 minute mark, and the Lady 'Cats cruised to a 73-23 victory.

The Lady ‘Cats were dominant on the boards in the contest, with Paige Patterson hauling in a season-high 14 rebounds and Harris pulling down eight.

“We definitely got a lot of offensive boards - we didn’t stick them back in the hole by any means, and we missed a lot of easy shots,” Allen said. “But, our girls definitely did a good job on the boards.”

Dexter’s perimeter shooting was much-improved in the contest; as a team, the ‘Cats hit 55% of their shots from beyond the arc. Six of Cobb’s points were from downtown, while all nine of Jarrell’s came off the deep ball. Harris and Patterson both had solid games inside, with 14 and 11 respective points.

“We shot a whole lot better from the perimeter tonight, I think we were six of 11, which is a lot better than in the past few games. Of course, when you start hitting perimeter shots, it opens up the inside, and I thought when that happened Brittany and Paige did a really good job of posting up and wanting the ball.”

The Lady ‘Cats kick off a brutal stretch of road games on Monday (Jan . 16) at Naylor; LBB won’t touch their home court until Tuesday, Jan. 31, when they face Meadow Heights.

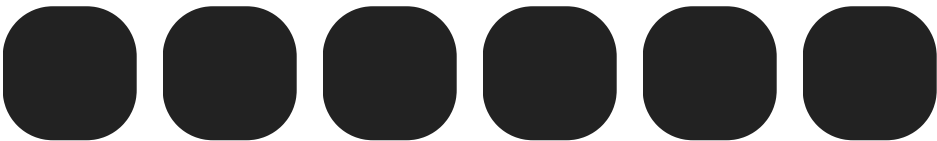

### Sailfish Open Season at Roger Dean Stadium

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla.- With less than a month away from the first pitch of the 2012 season, fans and alumni can feel the excitement surrounding the opening of another Sailfish baseball season. Palm Beach Atlantic University will open the 2012 campaign by hosting Lynn University on February 2nd at 7 pm when the two Palm Beach County rivals get together in Jupiter, Florida at Roger Dean Stadium.

This will mark the third straight season that PBA will begin the baseball season at Roger Dean Stadium which is home to Major League Baseball's Florida Marlins and the defending World Series champion, St. Louis Cardinals.

The Knights are under the direction of Rudy Garbalosa who is entering his 11th season as the head skipper at Lynn while leading the program to a NCAA Division II National Championship in 2009.

Fans will have the opportunity to participate in on-field promotions, enjoy traditional ballpark concessions, and experience a big league atmosphere from anywhere in the ballpark. Families are encouraged to bring everyone out for an exciting evening of PBA Baseball.

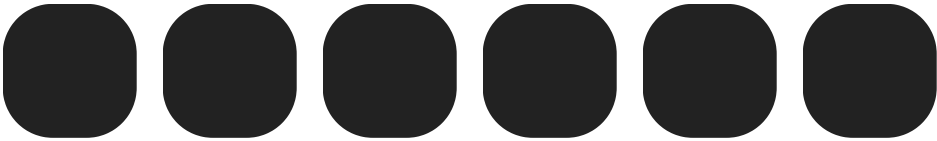
