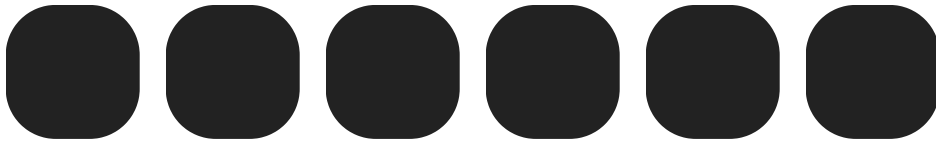
Besides her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by one half-brother, William Paterson.
