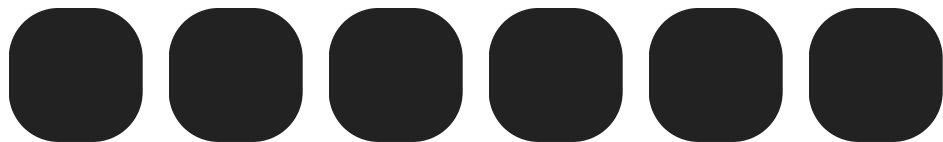

Besides his wife and parents he was preceded in death by one daughter, Vonda Jean Hessling.

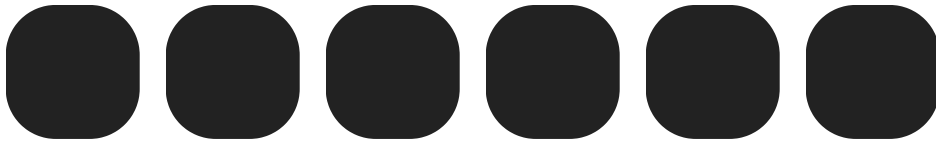

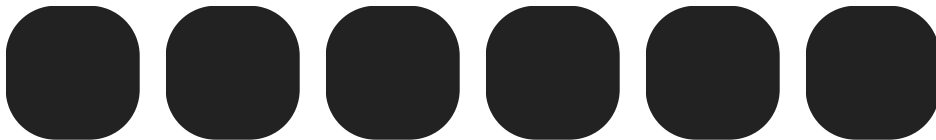
