The little sluggers have two more weeks of competition before the 2012 season wraps up on Friday, June 29, barring any additional rain-outs.

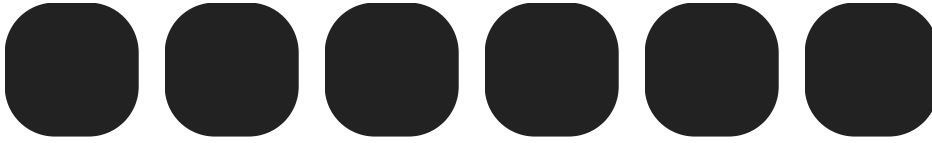

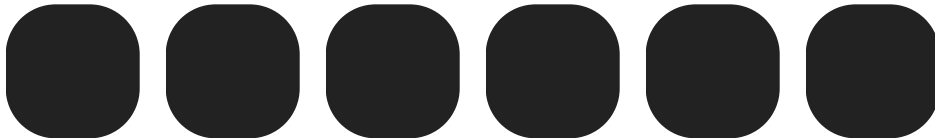
