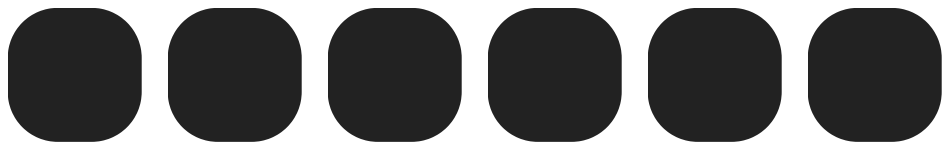
Preceded in death by her parents, Raymond and Lillian Atherton: by one brother Marion Dwain Atherton.
