13 basketball season Friday night as they defeated the Richland Rebels at home by a score of 73 to 40.

After struggling offensively in the opening games this year against the strong opponents of Charleston (27-70), Sikeston (23-55) and Jackson (23-55), the Bearcats were able to find strong performances by senior Chase Young and junior D. J. Dowdy to combine for 43-points. Young was the leading scorer on the night with 22-points and Dowdy followed with 21-points.

As an injured and young team, the 'Cats have faced this season by putting together the pieces of a frazzled puzzle. Tonight was a well deserved victory for their hard work and hope that the season will improve as they move forward.
