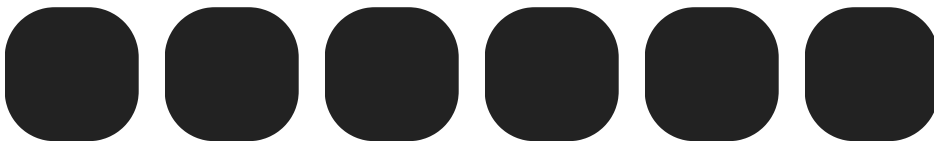

ready for the Christmas holiday and school break.

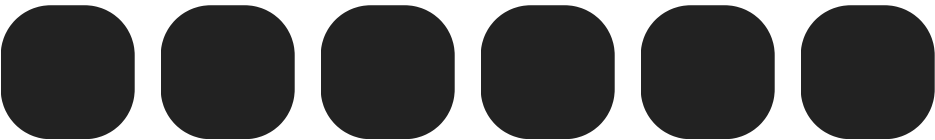
Honey Patel and Katie DeWitt dressed alike sporting their STUCO t-shirts. STUCO is short for Student Council as they are members of this student organization.
