Bloomfield, Missouri - The Richland Rebels were no match for the Kennett Indians in the opening game of the Bloomfield Christmas Tournament.

Kennett led the game 23 – 14 with over six minutes remaining in the first half before a 22-0 run pushed the lead to 45-14.

Kevonte Mitchell rallied a team high of 23 points for Kennett with Harold Weeden adding 13 more. Akeem Nelson, Antonio Primer, Antavies Drake and Cameron Harper also scored 10 points each.

Kennett (6-3) will play its quarterfinal contest Friday at 4 pm against #9 Bloomfield.
