leading again.

Just like every home game at Richland High School, the Pep Band led by Amber Duley, played a few songs to keep the crowd energetic and entertained. While the Rebels were in the locker room working on a strategy, the band played the *Hey Song*, *Land of a Thousand Dances*, *September*, and their favorite classic: *Go Big Red*.
