Both David Baker #31 and Troy Kirkpatrick #14 scored 16 points against Notre Dame. Baker was able to capitalize on four 3-pointers to help the Mules, but the Bulldogs hit right back with Quinn Paythress #4 and Cody DeBrock #2 who had a combined 31 points and Dereck Hulshof #42 who had 10 points.

Coach Botsch further explained, "They got way too many open looks from there and around the basket and they really hurt us on the backboard." The Notre Dame Bulldogs had nine players with baskets during the game, five being 3-pointers.

The Bernie Mules will have to work hard in practice this week and begin to prepare for Hayti on Tuesday, February 5th. "Hopefully, we will take some of these lessons from this game and work hard for district which are in two weeks," commented Botsch.

Final Score Bernie Mules 50, Notre Dame Bulldogs 64. Bernie's record drops to 18-4.

It was no different for the JV team. The Junior Varsity record dropped to 18-2 for the season as the Notre Dame Bulldogs completely out played them Friday night as well.

Caleb Ellenburg had an awesome 31 points for the Bernie Mules, but the Bulldogs just kept fighting back. Final Score Notre Dame 60, Bernie Mules 45.

"I thought both teams came out flat in the first half," stated Bernie's Head Coach Brad Botsch. "Massey really had his way with us in the beginning and I thought our kids were really trying to stop him. He is a very good player."

Jamie Massey #32 for the Hornets scored 17 points for the Hornets as he dominated the court most of the first half.

David Baker #31 for the Mules was the leading scorer with 23 points. he had 19 of those points in the first half. B.J. Jennings #12 had 16 points along with Sam Turner #45 who had 10 points in the game.

The Bernie Mules and the Holcomb Hornets currently support the best records in each of their nine teams in Class 2, District 1, which Hayti won last season. Bernie is 2-1 against Holcomb, beating them in the championship of the Campbell Invitational Tournament and in the championship semifinal of the Bloomfield Christmas Tournament.


