"Behold my servant, whom I have chosen; my beloved, in whom my soul is well pleased: I will put my spirit upon him, and he shall show judgment to the Gentiles. He shall not strive, nor cry..."(Matthew 12:18-19).

Jesus shows us by His example what a chosen and anointed servant is like.

First, He shall not strive. The word means, "to contend, to dispute; to argue with irritating persistence." This, Jesus never did; nor should we who seek to follow His way. He spoke the truth in love, and what He said stood on its own merits — needing no argument to attest to its authenticity.

Second, He shall not cry. This doesn't mean He will not shed tears, for we have read that Jesus wept. Rather, the word means, "to make a clamor; to protest insistently and noisily." You know, it's that obnoxious and dominating style of pontificating that so often shows up in public debates. In fact, the distinction between striving and crying is the one is private, and the other public.

Striving is how one individual acts when speaking to another individual, particularly if the other disagrees with what is being said. Crying is how an individual acts when speaking to a crowd; using hype and emotion, and force of opinion, as a cover for his lack of truth and substance.

Thomas Carlyle said, "In any controversy, the moment we feel anger we have already ceased striving for the truth and have begun striving for ourselves."

As you scan the broad range of voices competing for your attention, take special note of those who do not strive, nor cry. Give them a listen, and if their speech and spirit bring honor to Jesus, then heed what they say — follow where they lead. For you have come upon a chosen servant.

Finally, in the greater sense, pray that you may be such a person — someone whom God would choose to use; in whom He is well-pleased, and upon who He would put His spirit.

Someone so anchored in truth and covered with love that there is no need for striving and crying — just serving for the greater good of all who cross your path.

Wouldn't that be something?

Staring at What Isn't There

"Be anxious about nothing..." (Philippians 4:6, The Living Bible)

Philippians 4:6-7 (New King James Version)

- (6) **Be anxious for nothing**, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;
- (7) and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:6-7 (New Living Translation)

- (6) Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all He has done.
- (7) Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

The definition of the word nothing means "something that does not exist."

The definition of the word anxious means "to be troubled with care; to concentrate one's thoughts upon something in a fretful manner."

Could anything be more incongruous than a person focusing all their fretful thoughts upon something that doesn't even exist?

Yet people do it every day, almost all day long.

Detached from the present, their eyes somewhat glazed with vacancy, they dismiss the obvious for the oblivious — staring at something that's not even there. They are unable to appreciate what they actually do have, because they are so wrapped up with anxiety over what they do not have.

One of my favorite hymns that I learned as a boy encourages us to count our many blessings. "When upon Life's billows you are tempted, tossed; when you are discouraged thinking all is lost. Count your many blessings, name them one by one. And it will amaze you what the Lord has done!" (Justin Oatman, 1856)

It is true. A few thoughtful moments spent in thankfulness to God for the many blessings that undeniably are yours, will quell the whispering voices that beckon you to become upset by staring at nothing.

Next time anxiety begins to crowd your space, step back and start counting your many blessings — not generally, but specifically. Name them, one by one.

Let your mind dwell upon the massive benefits which the Lord has downloaded into your life. You'll find in no time that by looking at what is really there, your imagination will no longer drift into the darkness of what is not there.

Hey, you there! Stop staring; and start counting your many blessings!

It involves people doing random acts of kindness for others without expecting anything in return. Instead, recipients are instructed to "pay the kindness forward" to others in need, essentially creating a positive ripple effect of giving.

"I am overwhelmed by the support. Of course we should be paying it forward each and every day, but many of us get so caught up in the rush of every day life that we lose sight of what is most important," commented Beattie. "The Pay it Forward Day is a great reminder of the positive energy when we give to others."

"This day's concept is to help others. And instead of expecting something in return, you ask the recipients to pass the kindness on to more folks, "to pay it forward," continued Beattie.

How can you get involved? Of course, you don't need to wait until Pay It Forward Day to make a difference in someone's life! Everyday should be proclaimed Pay It Forward Day.

Here is a list of just a few ways you can participate today and make a difference in someone's life.

- 1. While at your favorite coffee shop on the way to work, pay for someone's cup of coffee or after work while getting your favorite soda, pay for theirs.
- 2. Buy treats and leave them out for your co-workers. Sometimes that surprise is all someone needs to turn a frown upside down.
- 3. Make a donation to your favorite charity. Or donate your time.
- 4. Help your neighbor out with yard work or deliver their mail to their door.
- 5. Sit down with your kids and write out Get Well cards to be distributed at a local hospital.
- 6. Sign up to be an organ donor and get on the match list.
- 7. Long line at the drive-thru, pick up the tab of the person behind you. That wills surely make their day.

Ephesians 4:1-7 NKJV

- (1) I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called,
- (2) with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love,
- (3) endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.
- (4) *There is* one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling;
- (5) one Lord, one faith, one baptism;
- (6) one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.
- (7) But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. People are saved when they trust Jesus Christ as Savior and choose to follow Him. Right then, most Christians realize that they will dwell with Him forever in heaven. But many don't understand what they can expect for the remainder of their lives on earth.

One benefit that's available immediately is a growing relationship with the Lord. The Father's oneness with Jesus (John 10:30) illustrates the intimacy God wants to have with His children. He had this type of closeness in mind at creation—a relationship with man is an avenue for Him to express His love and for us to worship and understand our Maker.

Another advantage is that Christ-followers are promised clear guidance through God's Holy Spirit. Decision making is a part of everyday life. It is impossible for a mere human to know every variable and nuance before choosing which path to take. But the Lord knows all things—past, present, and future. With godly wisdom available, it's hard to understand why anyone would prefer to trust his own hunches.


Provision is yet another blessing guaranteed for believers. There will be hard times, but God gives Christians everything necessary for following Him (Phil. 4:19). And His grace will always prove more than sufficient (2 Cor. 12:9).

How abundantly God gives to His children! One word of caution, though: these gifts are effective only when believers walk obediently with Him. Sin can stifle them.

The heavenly Father desires that all of His sons and daughters have these blessings; if you're living in obedience before Him, they are available to you. Is anything getting in the way of your total submission to Him?
