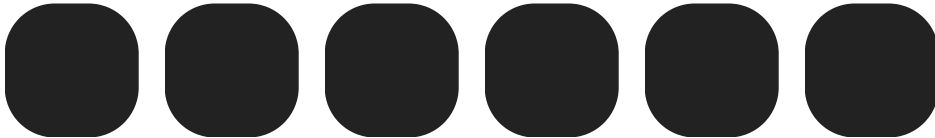

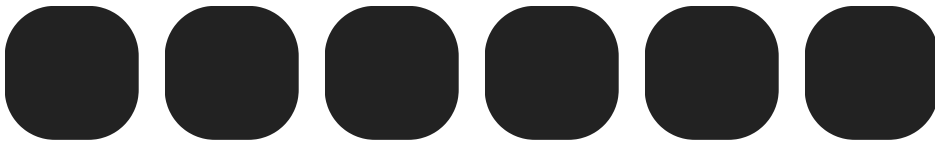
Interment will follow in the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri with full military honors.

Interment will follow in the Simmons Cemetery, Rural Catron, Missouri.

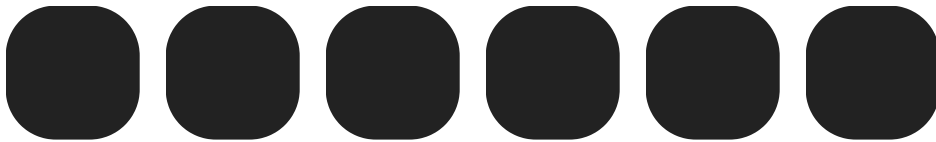
