Homecoming Candidates early on Thursday morning during Class and Club Meeting Day. It had been a long awaited week to see the revealing of the King and Queen.

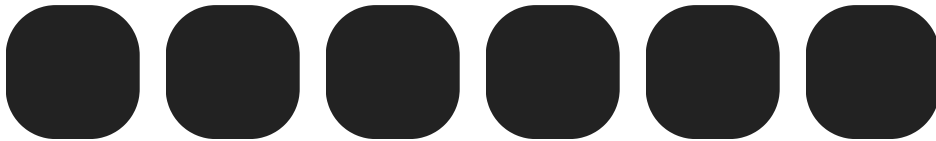
