**Cape Girardeau, Missouri -** Prospective students and their parents are invited to attend "Show Me Day" Feb. 15 on the campus of Southeast Missouri State University.

"Show Me Day is an opportunity for individuals interested in Southeast to visit our campus and see the wide variety of academic programs and services we offer," said Lenell Hahn, director of Admissions.

"Students can find out about Southeast's admission process, meet with faculty from our academic departments, and interact with current Southeast students," Hahn said. "We are thrilled to have students and parents here to explore and experience our vibrant and growing campus community. We want them to get as much information as possible during the day so they feel confident when they choose Southeast."

The day will begin with registration at 9:30 a.m. in the Student Recreation Center. Students are invited to browse through a Student Life Fair after they register from 9:30 to 10 a.m. The fair will allow prospective students to meet Southeast students and staff from areas such as Career Services, Residence Life, Dining Services, Greek Life, Academic Support Centers and the Honors Program.

The day will officially begin at 10 a.m. with a presentation by the Director of Admissions, followed by an introduction of Southeast admissions staff and student leaders. Prospective students also will have an opportunity to meet Southeast's Redhawks mascot, Rowdy, who will make a special guest appearance along with the Southeast Sundancers and Cheerleaders. Following the presentation, an "Academic Fair" will take place in the Student Recreation Center East Gym, and will feature informational displays of the University's various academic departments.

After participating in the Academic Fair, prospective students may attend presentations on financing their education, living on campus, and transferring to Southeast. Show Me Day will conclude with a tour of campus and the opportunity to dine during lunch in Towers Café.

"Southeast is fortunate enough to have award-winning dining facilities, and we want our guests to experience the quality and value offered to our students," Hahn said.

Students interested in the arts are invited to visit Southeast's River Campus, the only campus in the state dedicated solely to the fine arts.

"The big advantage to students studying the fine arts (theatre, dance, art and music) together is they have the opportunity to learn from each other in an environment dedicated solely to their areas of study," said Rhonda Weller-Stilson, associate dean and director of the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts.

Crisp II Museum at Southeast Missouri State University's River Campus. There are several students in Stoddard County who

"Exhibiting Excellence" showcases the talents of junior and senior high school students from southern Illinois and southeast Missouri.

An opening reception will be held from 2-4 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 9.

Awards in sculpture, ceramics, printmaking, mixed media, photography, fibers, drawing, painting, the Art Academy and Best of Show will be presented. The Art Academy Award will be given to a junior for outstanding work; this junior will receive a scholarship to attend one of the University's summer Art Academy workshops. The Best of Show recipient will receive a \$1,000 scholarship to attend Southeast as an art major.

This year's juror will be Jennifer Meroe Kennedy of Pomona, III., a substitute teacher in the Unity Point School District #140, Carbondale School District #95 and Carbondale Community High School. She formerly served as a visiting assistant professor in art education at Southern Illinois University-Carbondale where she taught "Studio Art for Teachers," "Secondary and Elementary Methods for Art Educators" and "Adaptations for Students with Disabilities."

Kennedy has extensive teaching experience, having taught art at Cobden (III.) Community High School, Pinckneyville (III.) Community High School, in the Steeleville (III.) Community Unit District, at the Carbondale Mega Arts Mini Camp and at McKinley Elementary School in St. Louis. She also has been a special education teacher's assistant at Edgewood Children's Center in Webster Groves, Mo.

Kennedy juried the Shawnee Community College High School Art Show last year and is a freelance illustrator for "The Wonderful Ride By Esther Claussen 2012." The past two years, she has taught professional development workshops on arts integration for Meridian (III.) Elementary School. She is a member of the National Art Education Association, the Illinois Art Education Association and the National Education Association.

She holds a Master of Arts in Teaching in art education from Webster University and Bachelor of Arts in studio arts from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale.

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Three Rivers Ranks Among Fastest Growing in Nation

**Poplar Bluff, Missouri -** Community College Week, the nation's leading periodical for community, technical, and junior colleges, has declared Three Rivers College one of the fastest growing community colleges in America for the second year in a row.

The periodical ranked Three Rivers as the number one fastest growing institution among colleges with 2,500-4,999 students during the period from Fall 2011 to Fall 2012. During that time, enrollment at Three Rivers rose by 921 students, the highest gross increase in its category, with an overall 25% jump in enrollment.

# FAFSA Frenzy Events at SEMO

**Cape Girardeau, Missouri -** Southeast Missouri State University will host FAFSA Frenzy for high school seniors and their families at four locations during February.

They are as follows:

Feb. 9: 2–4 p.m., Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau in Dempster Hall at the corner of Henderson and New Madrid Streets.

Feb. 11: 6-8 p.m., Southeast Missouri State University-Kennett

Feb. 13: 6-8 p.m., Southeast Missouri State University-Malden

Feb. 18: 6-8 p.m., Southeast Missouri State University-Sikeston

FAFSA Frenzy, a program of College Goal Sunday (CGS), is a free state-wide event in which financial aid experts assist high school students and their parents in completing the 2014-2015 Free Application for Federal Student Aid, the first step in applying for federal financial aid and state grant programs.

Students use the FAFSA application to apply for federal student grants, work-study and loans to assist them in funding their college education. They also may use this application to apply for most state and some private financial aid.

Families participating in FAFSA Frenzy will be able to complete the 2014-2015 FAFSA on-site and obtain valuable information. 2014 FAFSA Frenzy events will mark the 10th year Missouri has participated in CGS. In the past nine years, CGS/FAFSA Frenzy has helped more than 9,500 Missouri students complete the FAFSA.

Additional FAFSA Frenzy events are being conducted across the state. Dates, times and locations for all events are available at **www.dhe.mo.gov** or www.masfap.org/showmetocollege. Scholarships will be drawn for students attending any FAFSA Frenzy event in Missouri. Winners will receive their scholarships upon receipt of enrollment verification for the 2014 fall term in a Missouri postsecondary program.

FAFSA Frenzy is offered in Missouri through partnerships between the Missouri Department of Higher Education (MDHE) with the Missouri Association of Student Financial Aid Personnel (MASFAP), the Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority (MOHELA), the Lumina Foundation for Education and USA Funds.
