He was preceded in death other than by his parents by one brother, Edward James; and by two sisters, Maggie Jines and Grace Creasy.



Visitation will be held on Wednesday February 26, 2014, after 10:00 a.m. at the Watkins and Sons Funeral Home in Puxico, Missouri.



Toot's favorite saying when asked how she was doing was, "Fine and dandy. Sweet as candy!"


