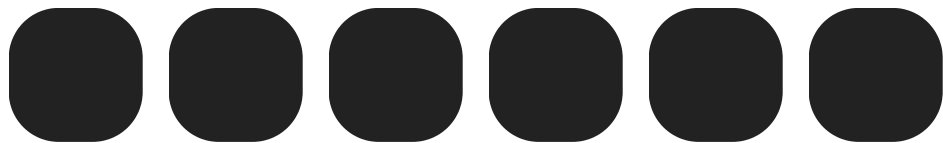

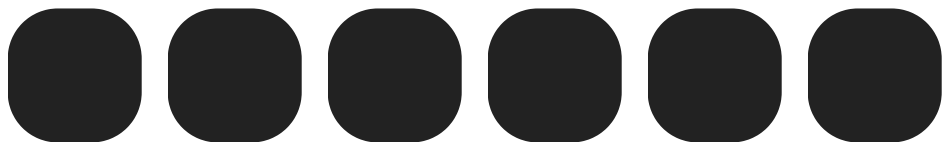
Congratulations to all of the students who practiced many hours. The middle school band students are under the direction of band instructors Chris Jinkerson and Scott Rybolt.
