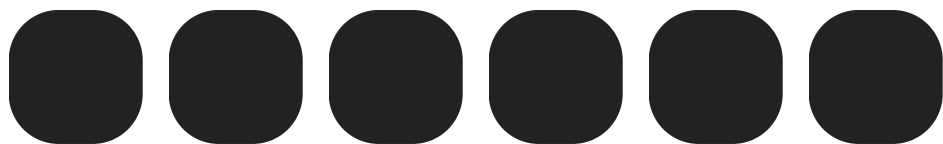

Come and see a classic brought to life with professional sets, costumes, and performers.

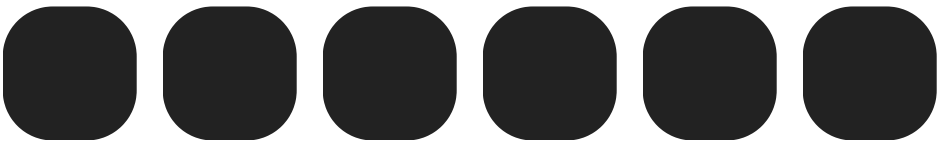
