NMCC Continues Winning Streak Defeating Dexter 83-68

New Madrid, Missouri – The Dexter Bearcats ended their 3-game winning streak when the New Madrid County Central Eagles flew away with the win Friday night in New Madrid.

"Our goal was to come out with a lot of energy, playing our style," NMCC head basketball coach Travis Day said. "I knew their defense was going to pack it in the paint on Willie. We told our shooters to have your hands and feet ready and if you are wide open let it fly."

NMCC definitely let it fly in the first half hitting 8 three-pointers to secure a comfortable half-time lead 46 – 20.

Willie Jimerson paced the Eagles with a team-high 19 points including one 3-pointer. Deon Jenkins tallied 12 points and Vontre Jones finished with 11 points.

Drew Palmer hit three treys adding nine for the Eagles. Mikael Walker added 9 points. Kiel Causey and Javarcus Word both scored 8 points.

"That's kind of our style," continued Day. "Willie is our head guy, but we usually have a lot of guys contribute night-in and night-out. We are good about sharing the ball and our style allows for a lot of people to get their hands on the ball.

Dexter put together a better second half scoring 7 three-pointers and outscoring NMCC by 11 points, but it was not enough to overcome the first half deficit.

"I was very proud of how the kids battled back in the second half," stated Dexter head basketball coach Josh Dowdy. "Real proud. It would have been easy to quit and we did not do that tonight. Tyler Heil came in and gave us some big minutes. I have been coaching for 10 years and have been around quite a few kids and there is not a better teammate than that young man. His actions on the court are the epitome of a great teammate. I am just glad he had a chance to shine and he did with some big block-outs, a charge, and a stickback."

Jason Jarrell tallied a team-high 19 points including one 3-pointer.

Austin Chesser added 17 more along with hitting two treys.

Ethan Flowers finished with 16 points including four 3-pointers.

Peyton Pollock hit one trey and finished with 8 points.

"Our goal was to make them shoot over the top of us. Unfortunately, they were eight of eleven behind the arc in the first half. I do wish we would have contested a little bit more, but you have to pick your poison against a team like NMCC," continued Dowdy. "If you go out and guard them they are more than capable of getting to the rim."

New Madrid County Central ranked #4 in Class 3 improved their record to 17-2 with the victory over Dexter.

"We were also able to run a few things /images/2015 Images/Coach Josh dowdy.jpg offensively in the second half that I feel will make us better down the stretch," stated Dowdy. "I believe it is worth noting the way Coach Day handled the game. There were some times where he could have kept his foot on the gas and he didn't. That shows a lot about his character and New Madrid County Central as a whole."

Dexter will now face Puxico in the SCAA Tournament on Monday at 8:00 p.m. They are ranked #3 with Puxico ranked #6. Games will be played at Bloomfield.

Three In a Row - Way to go Bearcats!

Dexter, Missouri – The Dexter Bearcats scored 24 points in the fourth quarter to secure their victory over the Puxico Indians 66-59 Tuesday evening.

"I thought the first half we came out and laid down to be honest," commented DHS head basketball coach Josh Dowdy. "But we showed some grit in the 3rd and 4th quarters and battled back. It's been a while since we have won three in a row so hopefully we can keep this thing rolling." Dexter defeated Bloomfield, Bernie and now Puxico. All Stoddard County teams.

Ethan Flowers tallied a game-high 25 points for Dexter. He hit five treys and in the fought back in the fourth quarter he scoring 12 points to defeat the Indians.

"Flowers had a great game for us," Dowdy said. "He shot it well, but also handled the ball when we needed him to and secured some big rebounds."

The Indians took their largest lead with about minute left in the third quarter forcing Dexter to either score or throw in the towel.

"We went on a 9-0 run to close out the third quarter to gain some momentum," stated Dowdy. "We caused them some problems with our press. It definitely tilted the game in our direction, no question. The kids came to the sideline at the end of the third quarter ready to finish Puxico off in the fourth quarter."

Austin Chesser finished with 13 points. He made five of seven free throws he attempted. Jacob Pedigo and Jason Jarrell also were in double digits adding 12 points each.

"It is nice to see we have four guys in double digits for a second straight game," Dowdy said. "It shows we know how to share the ball and we are unselfish. To win the county championship that's what we will have to continue to do."

Seth Luttrell hit 15 points for Puxico with Levi Woods tallying 13 more.

"Our goal was to create a pace to make their ball handlers perform instead of having them walk it down the floor and lob it to Tucker," continued Dowdy. "He is a such a presence inside and a tough match-up for us. Puxico was much more hungrier than we were tonight."

The SCAA Tournament begins on Monday, but before that the Bearcats must travel to New Madrid and play on Friday evening. Game time 6:00 p.m.

"We have to value each possession on offense and defense to be successful. We will have to play better next week when we meet them again in the first round of the SCAA Tournament," Dowdy stated.

Third-seeded Dexter and sixth-seeded Puxico will meet again at 8:00 p.m. Monday, January 25th at Bloomfield in the quarterfinal of the SCAA Varsity Boys Basketball Tournament.
