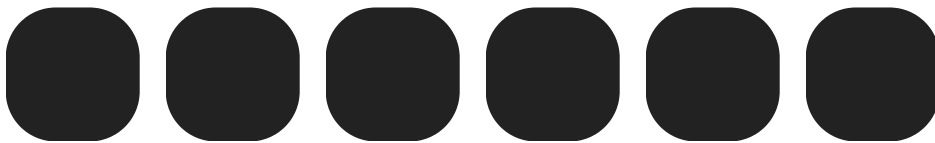

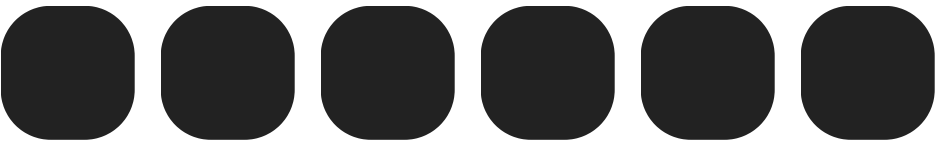
Funeral services will follow in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel at 2:00 P.M. with Herman Morse officiating.

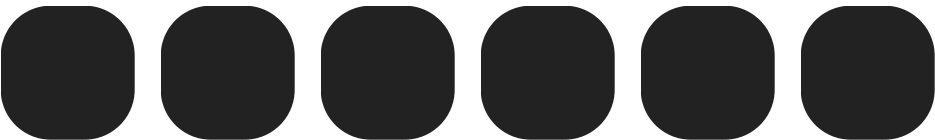
