Paul Haubold, Jr., son of Bengelene Brewer Haubold and the late Paul Edward Haubold, Sr., was born in Cape Girardeau, Missouri on November 13, 1950, and passed away at the Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri on September 23, 2015, at the age of 64 years, 10 months and 10 days.

Paul was raised in Marston, Missouri and graduated from Lilbourn High School in 1968. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1968 and was honorably discharged in 1972.

His career in law enforcement started in West Plains, Missouri in 1973 after graduating from the Police Academy. In 1976 he began working for the Dexter Police Department and was promoted to Shift Sergeant. In February 1979 he started a new career in transportation.

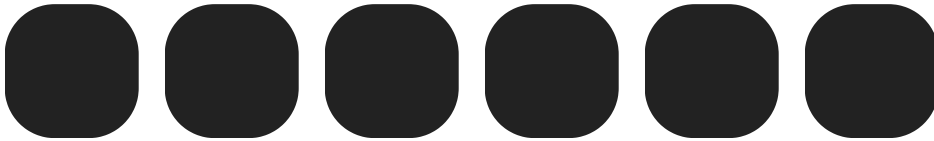
Interment will follow in the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield with Full Military Honors.

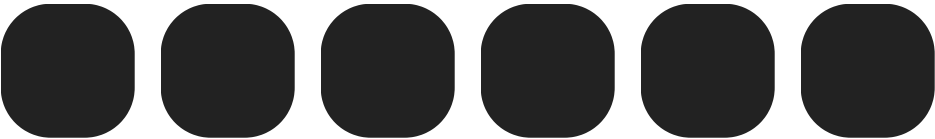
Funeral services will follow at 12:00 NOON in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel with Preston Owens officiating.
