They competed in several categories winning 1st Place in the parade competition.

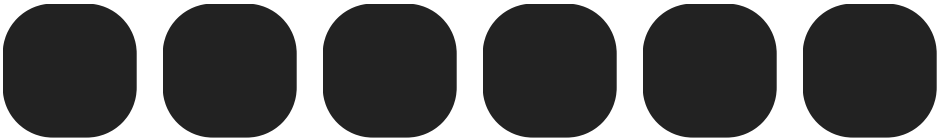
They also received Outstanding Music, Outstanding Marching, Outstanding Drum Majors, and Outstanding Percussion and 3rd Place performance in field competition.

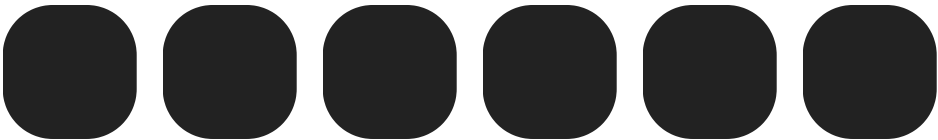
