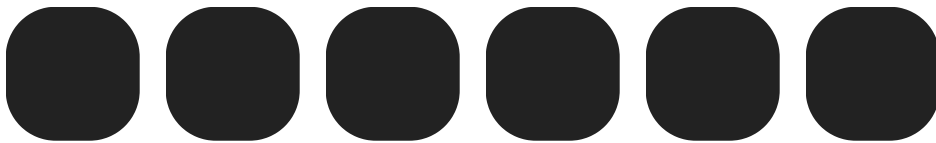

Besides her husband and parents she was preceded in death by one brother, Fred Nelson.

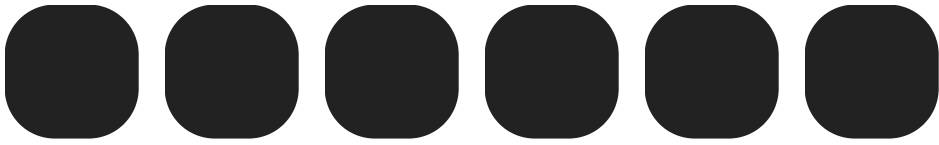
