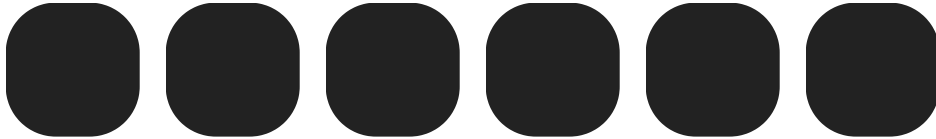

Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 from NOON until 2:00 P.M.

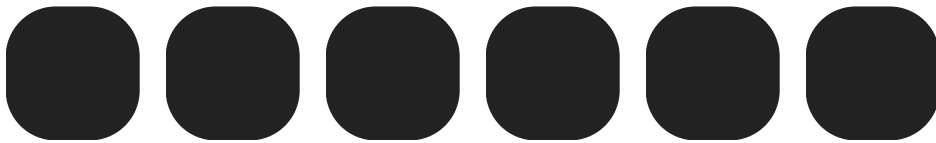
