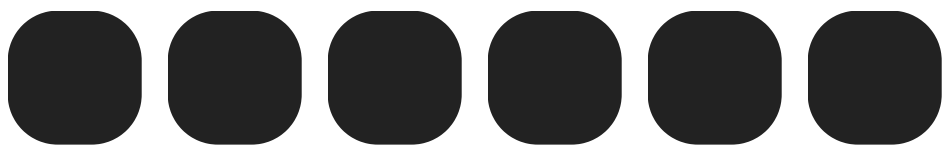
Funeral services were held on Saturday, October 22, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. at the Watkins & Sons Chapel in Dexter, Missouri.

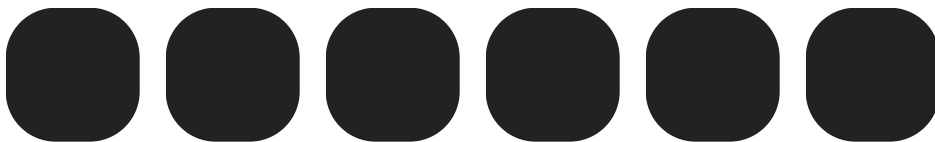
Funeral services were conducted at 2:00 P.M. in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel with Pastor Dale Hartle officiating.
