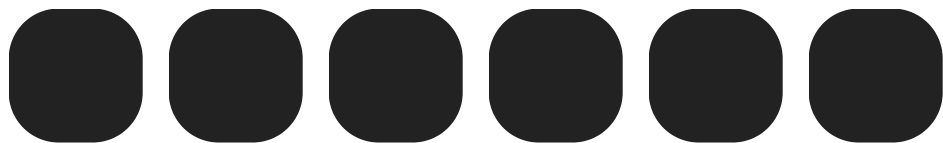

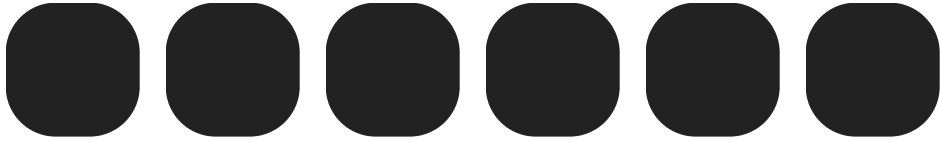
Besides her mother, she is preceded in death by one son, Michael Hook and by one brother Tyrone Hook.
