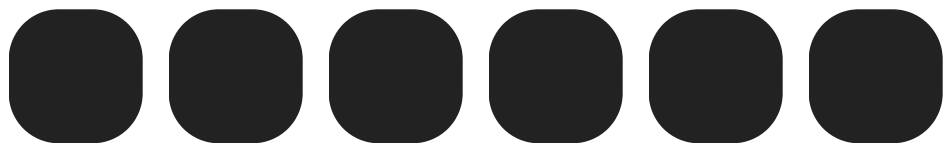

Interment will follow at the Missouri Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri.

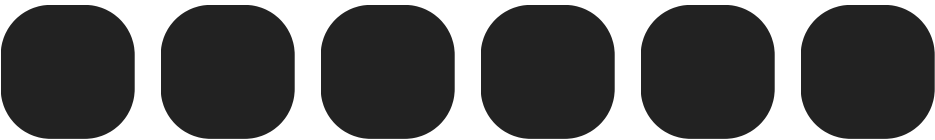
