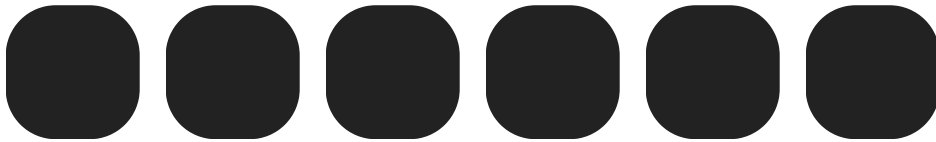

Elbert went on to coach and teach; a few students became basketball all-state players. In 1968 he and his family moved to the farm.

Friends may call on Monday, January 2, 2017, from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Chiles-Cooper Funeral Home in Bloomfield.

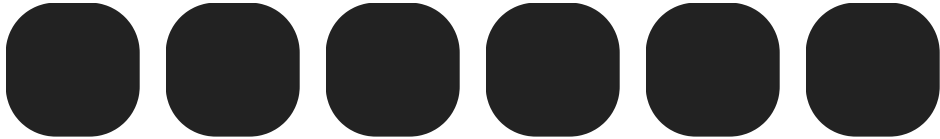
