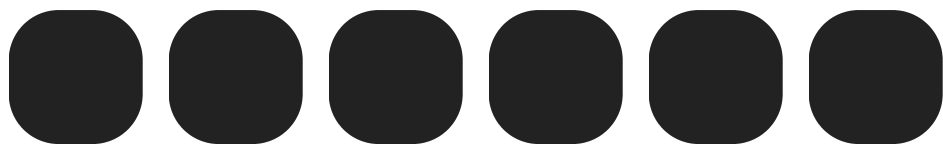
Interment will follow at the Dexter Cemetery.
