Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by her step-father, whom she was raised by, Steve Smith.

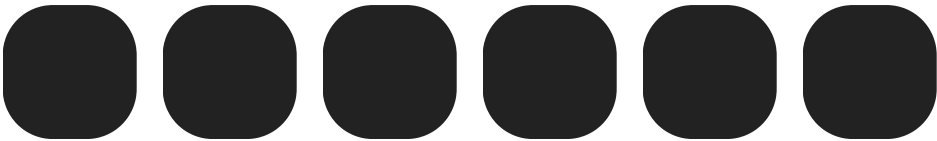
