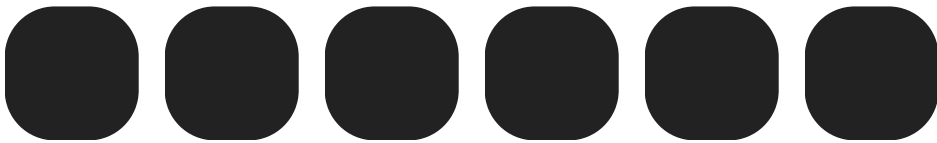
"Hard work, dedication, and teamwork will be what separates this group of athletes from their competition," Crook said.

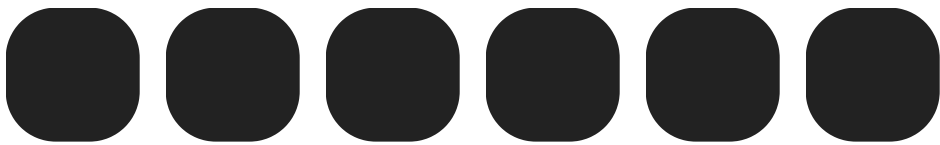
