She is serving as secretary-treasurer of the Stoddard County Historical Society and has recruited several new members.


She is a also a member of the Bloomfield Women's Club, the Bloomfield of Chamber of Commerce and the Crowley Ridge Black Powder Club.



Please support the Dexter Police Department as they raise money for Special Olympics!


