He was the contractor for building a new worship center and a fellowship hall. He now is restoring one of Bloomfield's historic homes.

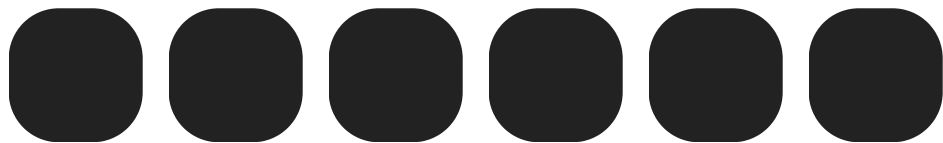
He is always willing to help someone in a time of need.

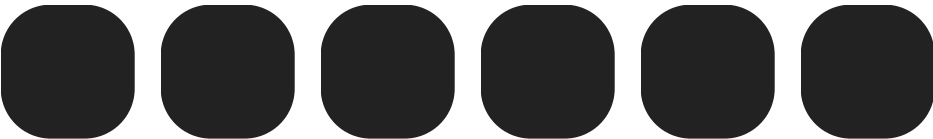
