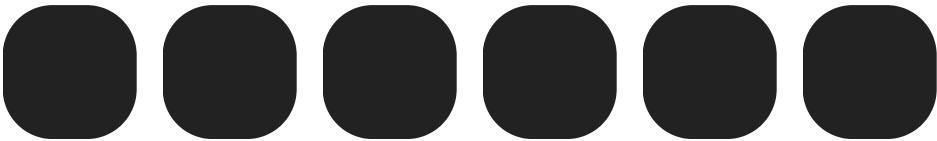
A memorial service will then be conducted in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel starting at 11:00 A.M.

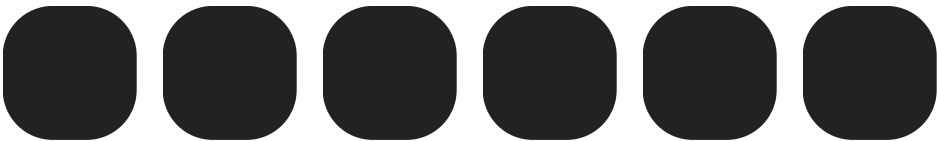
