Preceded in death by his parents and one sister, Mary McCullough Hillis.

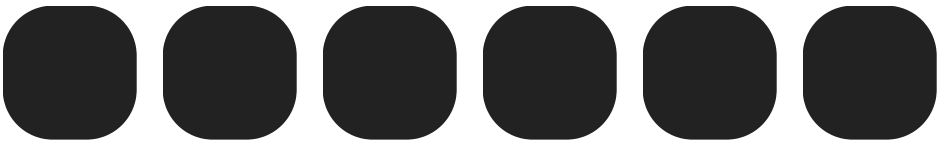

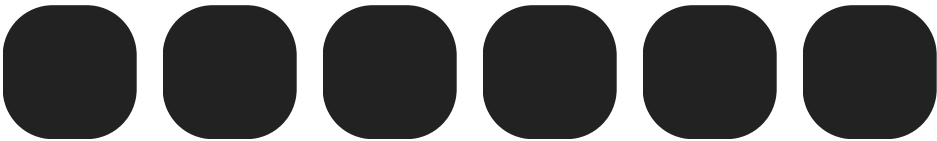
