She was preceded in death by her parents, three brothers and two sisters.

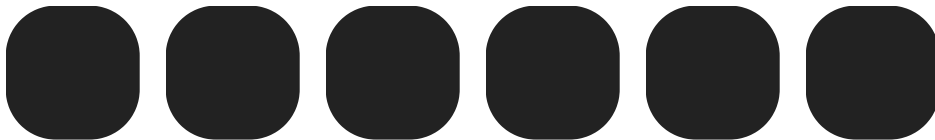

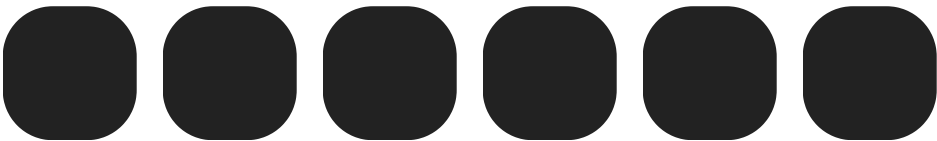
Interment will follow in the veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri.
