Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Tornado Watch until 10 p.m. for Stoddard County, Missouri.

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED TORNADO WATCH 513 IN EFFECT UNTIL 10 PM CST THIS EVENING FOR THE FOLLOWING AREAS IN ILLINOIS THIS WATCH INCLUDES 19 COUNTIES IN SOUTHEAST ILLINOIS EDWARDS IN SOUTHERN ILLINOIS ALEXANDER FRANKLIN GALLATIN HAMILTON HARDIN JACKSON JEFFERSON JOHNSON MASSAC PERRY POPE PULASKI SALINE UNION WABASH WAYNE WHITE WILLIAMSON IN INDIANA THIS WATCH INCLUDES 6 COUNTIES IN SOUTHWEST INDIANA POSEY IN SOUTHWEST INDIANA GIBSON PIKE SPENCER VANDERBURGH WARRICK IN KENTUCKY

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Dense Fog Advisory for Stoddard County, Missouri.

... DENSE FOG ADVISORY IN EFFECT UNTIL 9 AM CDT THIS MORNING... THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN PADUCAH HAS ISSUED A DENSE FOG ADVISORY, WHICH IS IN EFFECT UNTIL 9 AM CDT THIS MORNING.

* VISIBILITY... LESS THAN ONE QUARTER OF A MILE IN MANY LOCATIONS.

* IMPACTS... DENSE FOG WILL MAKE TRAVEL ACROSS THE REGION VERY DIFFICULT THIS MORNING. MOTORISTS SHOULD SLOW DOWN AND BE PREPARED FOR RAPID REDUCTIONS OF VISIBILITY.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS... A DENSE FOG ADVISORY MEANS VISIBILITIES WILL FREQUENTLY BE REDUCED TO LESS THAN ONE QUARTER MILE. IF DRIVING... SLOW DOWN... USE YOUR HEADLIGHTS... AND LEAVE PLENTY OF DISTANCE AHEAD OF YOU

Stoddard County, Missouri - Are you ready for cold temperatures? They are on their way to southeast Missouri this weekend along with rain on Friday! Jack Frost may make his autumn debut this weekend as well with temperatures dropping below freezing.

There is a chance of frost this weekend, so if you still have mums or other flowers in bloom don't forget to cover them up Friday and Saturday nights.

Friday, October 27, 2017 - Rain likely. Colder. High 52F. Winds NW at 10 to 15 mph. Chance of rain 100%. Rainfall around a quarter of an inch. At night the temperature will drop to 33F.

Saturday, October 28, 2017 - Cloudy early, becoming mostly clear after midnight. Low 33F. Winds WNW at 5 to 10 mph. Frost possible. At night the temperature will drop to 29F.

Sunday, October 29, 2017 - Sunny, along with a few afternoon clouds. High 52F. Winds WNW at 5 to 10 mph. Low temp will be 38F.

Stoddard County, Missouri - Special Weather Statement until 1 p.m. Monday! Heat Index Values 100 to 105 this afternoon.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 1PM CDT MON

...HEAT INDEX VALUES 100 TO 105 EXPECTED THIS AFTERNOON

... HEAT INDEX VALUES WILL REACH AT LEAST 100 DEGREES THIS AFTERNOON. SOME LOCATIONS WILL LIKELY EXPERIENCE HEAT INDICES AROUND 105 DEGREES, MAINLY FROM SOUTHEAST MISSOURI INTO SOUTHWEST ILLINOIS. THE ECLIPSE WILL TEMPORARILY LOWER HEAT INDICES INTO THE 90S. HEAT INDICES WILL REBOUND ABOVE 100 AFTER THE ECLIPSE.

ACTUAL AIR TEMPERATURES WILL TOP OUT IN THE LOWER 90S. HEAT INDEX VALUES AT OR ABOVE 100 DEGREES WILL LIKELY PERSIST THROUGH 6 PM TODAY.

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO BE OUTSIDE TODAY FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF TIME, BE SURE TO KEEP HYDRATED BY DRINKING PLENTY OF WATER. LOOK FOR OPPORTUNITIES TO GET OUT OF THE HEAT FROM TIME TO TIME, AND GET INTO THE SHADE OR IN AN AIR CONDITIONED BUILDING. KEEP WATCH ON THOSE PERSONS WHO MAY BE UNACCUSTOMED TO THE HEAT AND HUMIDITY.

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement until 6:00 p.m. Monday.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 6PM CDT MON

...HEAT INDEX VALUES 100 TO 105 EXPECTED THIS AFTERNOON OVER PART OF THE QUAD STATE REGION

... HOT AND HUMID CONDITIONS WILL BE THE RULE TODAY, REGARDLESS OF THE PASSAGE OF THE SOLAR ECLIPSE THROUGH THE REGION THIS AFTERNOON, AS AIR TEMPERATURES TOP OUT IN THE LOWER 90S.

HEAT INDEX READINGS ARE EXPECTED TO REACH 100 DEGREES BY NOON OVER SOUTHEAST MISSOURI. AS TEMPERATURES RISE INTO THE LOWER 90S, HEAT INDEX READINGS ABOVE 100 DEGREES WILL BUILD NORTHEAST ACROSS SOUTHERN ILLINOIS AND THE PURCHASE AREA OF WEST KENTUCKY, WEST OF THE LAND BETWEEN THE LAKES. HEAT INDEX VALUES AT OR ABOVE 100 DEGREES WILL LIKELY PERSIST THROUGH 6 PM CDT TODAY. THE REST OF THE QUAD STATE REGION WILL SEE HEAT INDEX VALUES TOP OUT IN THE UPPER 90S THIS AFTERNOON.

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO BE OUTSIDE TODAY FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF TIME, BE SURE TO KEEP HYDRATED BY DRINKING PLENTY OF WATER. LOOK FOR OPPORTUNITIES TO GET OUT OF THE HEAT FROM TIME TO TIME, AND INTO THE SHADE OR IN AN AIR CONDITIONED BUILDING.

Heat Index Values to Remain High

Stoddard County, Missouri - The National Weather Service in Paducah, Kentucky has issued a Special Weather Statement until 4 a.m. Monday morning.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT UNTIL 4AM CDT MON

...AFTERNOON HEAT INDEX VALUES 100 TO 105 DEGREES MONDAY

... THE HEAT AND HUMIDITY WILL CONTINUE ACROSS THE REGION MONDAY.

ALTHOUGH THE ECLIPSE ITSELF WILL PROVIDE SOME TEMPORARY RELIEF FROM THE HEAT, HEAT INDEX VALUES WILL STILL REACH AT LEAST THE UPPER 90S THROUGHOUT THE REGION AFTER IT ENDS.

THE WORST CONDITIONS WILL BE OVER SOUTHEAST MISSOURI, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS AND THE PURCHASE AREA OF KENTUCKY WHERE READINGS WILL RANGE FROM 100 TO 105 DEGREES. ISOLATED THUNDERSTORMS WILL BE POSSIBLE OVER PORTIONS OF SOUTHEAST MISSOURI AND SOUTHERN ILLINOIS IN THE AFTERNOON, SO A FEW LOCATIONS MAY RECEIVE SOME MORE SIGNIFICANT RELIEF FROM THE HEAT. IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO VIEW THE SOLAR ECLIPSE OR PARTICIPATE IN OTHER OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES, THEN PLEASE BRING ALONG PLENTY OF WATER TO KEEP HYDRATED. IF YOU HAVE ANY OPPORTUNITY TO DO SO, TAKE BREAKS IN THE SHADE OR IN AN AIR CONDITIONED BUILDING. A COLD FRONT WILL BRING STORMS THROUGH THE REGION ON TUESDAY AND COOLER TEMPERATURES FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE WEEK.

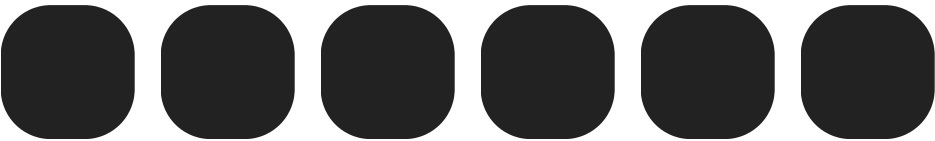

NORTHEASTERN STODDARD COUNTY IN SOUTHEASTERN MISSOURI... * UNTIL 430 PM CDT * AT 346 PM CDT, A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WAS LOCATED NEAR BELL CITY, OR NEAR ADVANCE, MOVING EAST AT 15 MPH. HAZARD...60 MPH WIND GUSTS AND QUARTER SIZE HAIL. SOURCE...RADAR INDICATED. IMPACT...HAIL DAMAGE TO VEHICLES IS EXPECTED.
